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**NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN**, that the persons hereinafter named will apply to His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor for a grant of Letters Patent of Incorporation under The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act and amendments thereto.

1. The proposed name of the Company is "The Antinori Fishing Club."

2. The objects for which the incorporation is sought are as follows:

(a) To promote the health and recreation of its members by the pursuit of fishing and hunting.

3. The office or chief place of business of the Club is to be at Jacquet River, in the County of Restigouche.

4. The amount of the capital stock of the Company is to be Five Thousand Dollars, divided into Five Thousand shares of a par value of One dollar each.
