

the factory, burned, buried or composted in such a manner that no offensive odor shall escape therefrom. The walls to a height of six feet, floors and tables shall be thoroughly cleaned at least once each and every day that the establishment is in operation.

#### SMALLPOX CASES TO BE IMMEDIATELY REPORTED.

In every instance when a case of smallpox is discovered in any health district in the Province, said case shall at once be reported by the Chairman of the Local Board to the Secretary of the Provincial Board, by telegraph, to be followed promptly by letter from him explaining fully,—nature of case, length of time sick, source of contagion, if possible, and any other particulars.

All regulations of the Provincial Board of Health heretofore in force are hereby repealed and the foregoing substituted therefor; such repeal not to in any way affect anything done under such regulations so repealed.
