(Extracts from the Rules of the Senate.) A LL Applications to Parliament for Private Bills of any mature whatsoever shall be advertised by a notice pub-lished in the Canada Gazette. Such notice shall clearly and distinctly state the nature and objects of the application, and shall be signed by or on behalf of the applicants, with the address of the party signing the same; and, when the appli-cation is for an Act of Incorporation, the same of the pro-posed company shall be stated in the motice. In Cases Where Exclusive Powers are Asked. In addition to the Notice in the Canada Gazette aforesaid, a similar notice shall also be published in some leading news-paper in the principal city, town or village in each county or district in each province or territory which may be affected by the passing of such Private Bills, according to the nature of the undertakings contemplated.
