PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS, under and by virtue of the provisions of the Act of the Legislative Assembly, 3 Edward the Seventh, Chapter 36, the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council, for the reasons set forth therein, did on the Twenty-Second day of November last past, pass an Order-in-Council declaring that no license or licenses for the sale of liquor, either by wholesale or retail, shall be issued or be in force in the Parish of Baker Lake, in the County of Madawaska, from and after the publication in the Royal Gazette of a Proclamation giving notice of such Order-in-Council, and that such Proclamation shall be issued on the third Tuesday in January, A. D. 1912, and be published in the first issue thereafter:

I do therefore, under and by virtue of the said Act of the Legislative Assembly, and of the said Order-in-Council so passed as aforesaid, hereby proclaim and declare that no license or licenses for the sale of liquor, either by wholesale or retail, shall be issued or be in force in the said Parish of Baker Lake, from and after the publication of this proclamation, as aforesaid.
