NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that the persons hereinafter named will apply to His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council for a grant of a Charter of Incorporation by Letters Patent under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick, according to the Provisions of the New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act, Chapter 85, of the Consolidated Statutes of New Brunswick, 1903, and Acts in amendment thereto, incorporating the applicants and such other persons as may hereafter become shareholders in the proposed Company, a body corporate and politic, under the name and for the purposes hereinafter set forth.

I. The proposed name of the Company is "Maritime Foundry and Machine Works, Limited."

II. The objects and purposes for which incorporation is sought are:

(a) To purchase, acquire and take over as a going concern the business and undertaking, plant, machinery and good will of the Foundry, Machinery and Mercantile business at present carried on by John W. McLennan and Frank H. McNaught, under the name and style of "Maritime Foundry and Machine Works," at the Town of Woodstock, in the County of Carleton, in the said Province, and also the Foundry, Machinery and Mercantile business at present carried on by James Miller under the name and style of "Miller's Foundry and Machine Works," at Chatham, in the County of Northumberland, in the said Province, with the real estate, personal property, plant, machinery, effects and other assets of both of the said firms; and for carrying on and conducting the business of Foundry and Iron Works, smelting and casting; and for the buying, selling and manufacturing of all classes of metals, and the products thereof; and the manufacturing, buying, selling and supplying of all kinds of machinery, engines, boilers, pipe, electrical machines, fittings, railway supplies and other articles made from any kind of metal or wood; and the carrying on of the general business of merchandise as hardware merchants, foundrymen and machinists; and the importation and sale of iron, steel, brass, silver, copper and all other kinds of metal and the products thereof, and all articles made therefrom, and any other general merchandise of all classes, nature and quality.

(b) For carrying on the business of wharfingers and all matters incidental thereto, and the doing and carrying on of all business and transactions of every kind incident or belonging or appertaining to any of the objects or purposes aforesaid, or which could be conveniently carried on in connection therewith.

(c) To amalgamate with or purchase and procure conveyances of and operate any mills, manufactories, foundries, machine works, electric light companies and other mechanical operations, and merchandise, capital stock, stock in trade or good will thereof, or of any bodies corporate having, holding or owning the same.

(d) To apply for, purchase or otherwise acquire, and to hold, own, use, operate and to sell, assign or otherwise turn to account any and all inventions, patents, improvements and processes used in connection with or secured under Letters Patent of Canada, or any other country.

(e) To purchase, lease, acquire, have and hold real and personal estate of all kinds, including bonds and stock of any incorporated Company or Companies, and to take, acquire, have and hold security upon any real or personal property or effects whatsoever, and to let, sell, hypothecate, mortgage or otherwise dispose of the same.

III. The office or principal place of business is to be at the Town of Chatham, in the County of Northumberland, in the Province of New Brunswick.

IV. The amount of the capital stock of the Company to be incorporated to be forty-nine thousand dollars, divided into four hundred and ninety shares of one hundred dollars each.
