

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the persons hereinafter named will apply to His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council, for a grant of Letters Patent of Incorporation under "The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act," and amending Acts, incorporating and constituting the applicants and such other persons as may hereafter become shareholders of the proposed company a body corporate and politic under the name and for the purposes following:

1. The proposed corporate name of the Company is "Hutchings Company, Limited," and the said name is not the name of any other known company, nor is it a name liable to be confounded with the name of any other known company, or otherwise objectionable on public grounds.

2. The objects and purposes for which such incorporation is sought are:

(a) To acquire, own and continue to operate the several businesses now conducted by Charles H. Hutchings, under the firm name of "Hutchings and Company," at 101-103 Germain Street, in the City of Saint John; and by John Hannah at 75 Marsal street, in said city, and the property real and personal, goodwill, franchises and privileges of the said businesses, which the company may deem to be suitable for the purposes of the Company, or advantageously used in connection therewith.

(b) To acquire or undertake the whole or any part of the business, property and liabilities of any person, company or companies carrying on or authorized to carry on any business which the company is authorized to carry on, or any business similar or in part similar to the business which this Company is authorized to carry on, or possessed of property suitable for the purposes of the Company, with the power also to amalgamate with any such person or company.

(c) To acquire, construct, erect, establish, maintain and operate mills, factories, foundries and machine shops for the manufacture, working and production of all kinds of metals and articles made in whole or in part of metal, and supplies relating thereto, and of all articles made in whole or in part of wood, cloth, paper, excelsior, hair, flock, peat, sea-grass or other material, or whereof metal, wood, cloth, paper, excelsior, hair, flock, peat, sea-grass or other material, or whereof metal, wood, cloth, paper, excelsior, hair, flock, peat, sea-grass or other material is a component part, and of mattresses of every sort, beds, bedsteads, cots, springs, seats, railway fixtures, and furnishing, furniture and every and all articles of use in the business of an upholsterer or house furnisher, and to manufacture, buy, sell and deal in any or all of the said articles and engage in or carry on any or all of said operations, manufacturers or businesses by wholesale or retail, and either directly or through the medium of agents.

(d) To acquire by purchase, lease, concession, license, exchange or other legal title and to sell, mortgage and deal in real property, rights, of way and other immovable and mixed property as may be found useful, necessary or expedient in the prosecution and conduct of any or all of the operations of the Company.

(e) To acquire, build, erect, manage, maintain and operate all necessary buildings, stores, warehouses, shops, offices and such other erections as may be necessary or expedient for the use or employment of the company and others and to operate, lease, sell and dispose of the same.

(f) To carry on business of Merchants, and deal in supplies and general merchandise.

(g) To manufacture, purchase, lease or otherwise acquire machinery and any and all apparatus necessary or useful in connection with the business of the Company, and to sell, lease or otherwise dispose of the same.

(h) To promote or assist in promoting and becoming a shareholder in any subsidiary, allied or other company which carries on or has for its objects the operation of any business similar to that carried on by this company, and to enter into any agreement for sharing profits, union of interest, co-operation, joint adventure, reciprocal concession or otherwise, with any person or company carrying on or engaged in or about to carry on or engage in any business or transaction which this company is authorized to engage in or carry on, and to take or otherwise acquire shares and securities in such Company, and bonds or debentures issued thereby, and to hold, sell, re-issue with or without guarantee, or otherwise deal with the same.

(i) To apply for, purchase, acquire, lease, sell, license or otherwise dispose of trade marks, industrial designs, patent or patent rights, grants, license, trade names, concessions, copyrights or other form of industrial property which may be deemed useful to the company's business, and to acquire and work any patents of invention or any licenses to use any invention which may be deemed to be of use in connection with the company's business.

(j) To issue fully paid up shares, bonds, debentures or debenture stock of the company in payment or part payment of the purchase price of any property, real or personal, franchises, patent or other right, business or goodwill thereof acquired by the Company, or in payment of any services rendered or work performed for the Company, or in purchase of the bonds, stocks, property or assets of any other company having objects similar to those of the Company.

(k) To obtain from any government or state or from any potentate, local or other authority, any monopolies, concessions, charters, contracts, franchises, grants, privileges and rights, the acquisition or possession of which may appear likely to further the objects of or benefit the company, and to exercise, comply with, work, carry into effect and turn to account any grants, contracts or rights so obtained.

(l) To pay for any services rendered to any property or rights acquired by the Company in such manner as may seem expedient and in particular by the issue of shares or securities of the Company credited as fully or partly paid up.

(m) To sell, lease, transfer, improve, manage, develop, exchange, mortgage, turn to account or otherwise deal with, or dispose of the whole or any part of the business, property or undertaking of the Company to any other company (whether promoted by this Company or not), or to any person, firm or corporation, and to accept by way of consideration for any such sale, transfer, exchange, transfer or disposal, any shares, debentures, debenture stock, bonds, or securities of any other company.

(n) To do all such things as are incidental or conducive to the attainment of the above objects, with such other things as are incident thereto.

(o) The office or principal place of business is to be at the City of Saint John, in the City and County of Saint John, and Province of New Brunswick, or at such other place as the directors may from time to time determine.

(4) The amount of the capital stock of the company is to be Twenty-four Thousand Dollars, divided into Two Hundred and Forty shares of One Hundred Dollars each. The shares in the capital for the time being may be divided into several classes with any preferential, special, qualified or deferred rights, privileges or conditions attached thereto.

(5) The names, addresses and calling of each of the applicants are as follows:

John Wesley Cassidy, of the Parish of Simonds, in said City and County of Saint John, Accountant.

The said Charles H. Hutchings, John Hannah and John Wesley Cassidy are to be the first or provisional directors of the said Company.
