NOTICE OF GRANTING LETTERS PATENT.

PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given, that under Chapter Eighty-five of the Consolidated Statutes of New Brunswick, 1903, and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the Great Seal of the said Province, bearing date the Thirteenth day of January, A. D. 1912, incorporating Frank H. Elliott, Merchant; Stephen A. Payne, Accountant; Frank R. Fairweather, Insurance Agent; James G. Harrison, Merchant; all of the City of Saint John, and Province of New Brunswick; and J. Dufferin Mitchell, of the Parish of

Lincoln, in the County of Sunbury, in said Province, Accountant, for the following purposes, namely:

To carry on the business of a general construction company and contractors.

To engage in the business of constructing wharves, docks, railways, tunnels and other private and public works and undertakings, and to enter into contracts for the accomplishment of the same.

To establish, construct, acquire, operate, equip, maintain and manage mills, plants, factories, machinery and appliances necessary to carry on the business of contractors and builders in all branches, and to buy, purchase, and acquire by lease, assignment or otherwise, any lands, premises, rights, privileges and water powers necessary or desirable in the business or interests of the Company.

To engage in and carry on dredging operations, and to enter into contracts for the same, and for that purpose to build, acquire and obtain by purchase, lease or hire, all boats, vessels, dredges, stone-lifters, scows, plant, machinery and equipment for the carrying on of the same.

To amalgamate with any other company or companies having the same or similar objects, and to enter into all contracts and agreements necessary for such amalgamation.

To enter into any agreement with any authority, whether Dominion, Provincial, Municipal or otherwise, that may seem conducive to the Company's objects, or any of them, and to obtain from any such authorities any rights, privileges and concessions which the Company may think it desirable to obtain, and to carry out, exercise and comply with any such arrangements, rights, privileges and concessions.

To acquire by assignment, purchase, lease, sub-contract or otherwise, any contract, rights or privileges from any other person or persons, and to operate and complete the same.

To enter into bonds or obligations as sureties, and make and execute the same for the performance of any contract, or as sureties for the performance of contracts in which the said Company may be interested as contractors or sub-contractors, or otherwise.

To carry on any other business which may seem to the Company capable of being conveniently carried on in connection with the above objects, or calculated directly or indirectly to enhance the value of or render profitable any of the Company's property or rights for the time being.

To pay out of the funds of the Company all expenses incidental to the incorporation and organization of the Company; by the name of "The New Brunswick Construction Company, Limited," with a total capital stock of forty-nine thousand dollars, divided into four hundred and ninety shares of one hundred dollars each, and with the head office at Welsford, in the County of Queen's.

NOTICE is hereby given, that application will be made to the Legislative Assembly of New Brunswick at its next session for the passing of an Act to incorporate the "New Brunswick Hydro Electric Company," with power to acquire and develop the water power in the Lepreau River, the Magaguadavic River and their tributaries, and to generate electric, pneumatic, hydraulic or other force or power and to receive and transmit the same, and to acquire rights, easements, franchises and privileges necessary for the efficient operation of the Company, with power, upon permission by the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council, to expropriate for the purposes of the Company. Capital stock to be \$1,500,000, and Company to have power to issue bonds to an amount not exceeding the capital stock.
