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## NOTICES RE VALLEY RAILWAY.

NOTICE is hereby given, that there will be presented to the Legislative Assembly at the ensuing session the following bills respecting the Valley Railway, so called, which is to be built by The Saint John & Quebec Railway Company under a contract with His Majesty the King, acting therein in respect of the Government of the Province of New Brunswick, namely:

A Bill or Bills for the incorporation of a company or companies with power to build, or giving to said Saint John & Quebec Railway Company power to build, a railway bridge over the Saint John River at or near Andover, in the County of Victoria, and a railway bridge over the Saint John River at or near The Mistake, so called, and a railway bridge over the Kennebecas River at or near Perry's Point, so called.

Also a Bill or Bills to further amend the Act incorporating the Saint John & Quebec Railway Company, and for the purpose of ratifying and confirming an issue by said company of first mortgage bonds of twenty-five thousand dollars and second mortgage bonds of ten thousand dollars per mile of its said proposed railway, and for the purpose of ratifying and confirming the trust mortgages to secure the same, and also for other purposes.
