WHEREAS, Writs for a Legislative Assembly were issued on the twenty-fifth day of May last, returnable forthwith, and the Legislative Assembly was therein called to meet on the fourth day of July instant, I have thought fit further to prorogue the said Legislative Assembly, and the same is hereby prorogued accordingly to Thursday, the fifteenth day of August next.

PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS, Joseph D. Doucet, High Sheriff of the County of Gloucester, has made return to the Honourable the Provincial Secretary, setting forth that an election of the ratepayers of the Town of Bathurst, in the said County of Gloucester, was held at the Town of Bathurst on the 30th day of May last, to determine whether the inhabitants thereof should become incorporated under the provisions of Chapter 166 of the Consolidated Statutes, 1903, intitled "The Towns Incorporation Act."

That at such election there were two hundred and fifty-one votes cast, and one hundred and ninety-five of which being marked "for" and fifty-two marked "against."

That the boundaries of the said town are as follows:

"All that part of the Parish of Bathurst, in the County of Gloucester, comprised within the limits following, that is to say:

"To include the Burns Mill property (so called) lying east of Bathurst Harbor, thence across Nepisiguit Steel Bridge (to include all the land comprised in the Burns Farm, so called) in a direct westerly line till it strikes the west line of the said Burns Farm, following the said west line in a northerly direction to the north side of Merry Street, thence following said Merry Street in a westerly direction to the shore of Basin, thence including the Town Plot of Bathurst, also to include the Mill property of the O. F. Stacey Company (so called) following the course of Carter Brook to the Intercolonial Railway, thence north along said railway to the north side of the Deacon line (so called), thence along said line to the Restigouche Road; thence north along the east side of said road to the south side of lands now occupied by Angus Branch,

following said south line easterly to the shore, thence following the shore of Bathurst Harbor and Basin to the south side of the mouth of Carter Brook."

And it appearing by said return that a majority of the ratepayers of said Town have voted in favor of Incorporation, I do therefore proclaim that the said Town of Bathurst, comprised within the bounds hereinbefore described, be incorporated under and by virtue of "The Towns Incorporation Act."

Given under my hand and seal at Fredericton, the twenty-fifth day of June, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and twelve, and in the Third year of His Majesty's Reign.
