NOTICE is hereby given, that application will be made by the applicants hereinafter named to His Honor the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council, for a grant of Letters of Incorporation under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick, under the provisions of the New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act, and the several Acts in amendment thereof, incorporating and constituting the applicants, and such other persons as may become shareholders in the proposed Company, a body corporate and politic, under the name and for the purposes hereinafter mentioned:

1. The proposed corporate name of the Company is "The Canadian Mineral Development Company," which is not the name of any other known Company, or liable to be confounded therewith.

2. The objects for which such incorporation is sought and the powers of the Company, shall be as follows:

(a) To purchase, acquire, hold, use, occupy and possess mines, mining areas, mining licenses and leases, lands, tenements and hereditaments, and any interest or interests therein and the acquisition and development, work, purchase, and sale of mining lands and premises and mining leases, licenses, rights and privileges, and generally to carry on the business of mining, with all the powers necessary or incidental thereto.

(c) To construct, purchase, alter and maintain and to contribute to the purchase, construction, alteration or maintenance of any building, tramway, road or other work upon their own property, or upon easements or rights acquired thereof, calculated to afford any facility in carrying on or extending the business of the Company, and to operate such tramway and other works by steam, electricity or other motive power.

(d) To purchase, hire, construct or manufacture for use in connection with the business of the Company any rolling stock, machinery or plant.

(e) Subject to the provisions of the said Act, to sell or dispose of any part of the property or undertaking of the proposed Company, to any other person or Company.
