

**AN ACT TO FURTHER AMEND "THE NEW BRUNSWICK  
ELECTIONS ACT," CAP. 3, CONSOLIDATED  
STATUTES, 1903.**

(Passed 20th April, 1912.)

Be it enacted by the Lieutenant-Governor and Legislative Assembly, as follows:

1. That part of Section 110 of "The New Brunswick Elections Act," Chapter 3 of the Consolidated Statutes, 1903, so far as it relates to the sub-districts in the County of Charlotte, is amended as follows:

**In the Parish of Saint David.**

The polling place for sub-district Number Eight shall be at Oak Bay.

The polling place for sub-district Number Nine shall be at or near the School House at Brown's Corner.

2. That part of said Section 110, so far as it relates to the County of Gloucester, is amended as follows:

The description of sub-districts Numbers One and Two, are hereby repealed, and the following enacted in place thereof:

**In the Parish of Bathurst.**

Number One—For South Tetagouche, down as far and including the property of Maynard Smith, at or near the Episcopal Church.

Number One (a)—For all that part of the Parish lying northerly of Middle River and Bathurst Harbour, excepting sub-district Number One, as above, at or near the Post Office, Bathurst Village.

Number Two—For that part of the Parish lying east of Bass River, excepting Miramichi Road, at or near the School House, Salmon Beach.

Number Two (a)—For all that portion of the Parish lying south of the Papineau River and north of the Nepisiguit River, so and including the Bathurst Mines, at or near the School House at Mines.

Number Two (b)—For that part of the Parish lying between Bass River and the Nepisiguit River, including all of the Miramichi Road at or near the School House at Cross Roads.

Number Two (c)—For the remainder of the Parish, at the Court House.

**In the Parish of New Brandon.**

The description of sub-districts Numbers Seven and Eight are hereby repealed, and the following enacted in place thereof:

Number Six (a)—For all that part of the Parish, the shore or front lots between Hilarion Degraze's western line and the said rear line and the eastern line of land owned by Amos Comeau, Jr., at or near the Roman Catholic Church, Grand Anse.

Number Seven—For all the settlements known as Lin Landry, Saint Paul, Saint Joseph, Black Rock and Boudreau Settlements, at or near Isaac Godin's, Saint Joseph's.

Number Eight—For the remainder of the Parish, at or near the Presbyterian Church, Stonehaven.

**In the Parish of Caraquet.**

The description of sub-district Number Eleven is hereby repealed and the following enacted in place thereof:

Number Ten (a)—For all the district of Saint Simon, at or near the second School House, Saint Simon.

Number Eleven—For the remainder of the Parish, at or near the Roman Catholic Church, Lower Caraquet.

**In the Parish of Paquetville.**

The description of sub-district Number Twelve is hereby repealed and the following enacted in place thereof:

Number Twelve—For all that portion of the Parish comprising all Main Paquetville, Georgeville and Paquetville East, at or near the Roman Catholic Church, Paquetville.

Number Twelve (a)—For all the Millville Settlement, Burnsville, and to the eastern line of the Parish, at or near the School House in School District Number Three.

**In the Parish of Saint Isidore.**

Number Fourteen—For all that portion of the Parish known as Tilley Road, at or near the School House at James Thomas.

Number Fourteen (a)—For the remainder of the Parish, at or near the Roman Catholic Church, Saint Isidore.

**In the Parish of Inkerman.**

The descriptions of sub-districts Number Eighteen and Nineteen are hereby repealed and the following enacted in place thereof:

Number Eighteen—All that part of the Parish lying north of the Grand Pokemouche River east to the Paulin Bridge on Shippegan Road; also all that part of the Parish west of South River, including the creek, to the Buckley Road, at or near Edmund Sewell's.

Number Nineteen—All that part of the Parish known as the Island of Pokemouche and east of South River, east of Grand Pokemouche River, Saumarez parish line; also that part of the Parish east of Paulin Bridge, on the Shippegan Road to Shippegan Parish line, at or near Peter C. Robichaud's.

Number Twenty—All the remainder of the Parish, including Saint Rose, at or near John Whitty's.

3. That part of said Section 110, so far as it relates to the County of Kent, is amended as follows:

The description of sub-district Number Seven, the Parish of Wellington, is hereby repealed, and the following enacted in place thereof:

**In the Parish of Wellington.**

The Parish of Wellington is hereby divided into three polling sub-districts, the boundaries of which shall be identical with the three districts into which the said Parish is divided for Municipal purposes, and shall be numbered as follows:

Number Seven—Municipal District Number 1, polling place at or near Buctouche Village.

Number Seven (a)—Municipal District Number 2, polling place at or near the Post Office at St. Francis de Kent.

Number Seven (b)—Municipal District Number 3, polling place at or near the Post Office, Saint Pierre, Black River.

**In the Parish of Harcourt.**

That a new polling sub-district be added to be known as Number Eighteen (a), to comprise the following:

Eighteen (a)—All that portion of said Parish lying between Trout Brook, of the Salmon River, and Queen's County

line, polling place at or near Lake Stream Post Office.

4. That part of said Section 110, so far as it relates to the County of Northumberland is amended as follows:

By repealing the description of Number Twelve, Parish of Blackville, and enacting the following in place thereof:

**In the Parish of Blackville.**

Number Twelve—For all the electors residing on the Renous River and Dungarvon River, easterly to the parish line between Derby and Blackville, across river along line between Nelson and Blackville, up river to Thomas Vicker's lower line, across river and on along Thomas Coughlan's upper line to James M. Smith's, at or near Indiantown Hall.

Number Twelve (a)—For the remainder of the electors of the Parish of Blackville, at or near Blackville Public Hall.

By repealing the descriptions of Numbers twenty-one, twenty-two and twenty-three, parishes of Chatham and Glenelg, and enacting the following in place thereof:

**In the Parish of Chatham.**

Number twenty-one—For all that part of the Parish of Chatham lying east of the Forrest Road, at or near the School House at Loggieville, in the Parish of Chatham.

Number Twenty-two—For all that part of the Parish of Chatham lying west of the Bacon Road, at or near the Temperance Hall at Chatham Head.

Number Twenty-three—For all the remainder of the electors for the Parish of Chatham, at the Town of Chatham.

**In the Parish of Glenelg.**

Number Twenty-four—For all that part of the Parish beginning at the Bay Shore at Point-au-Car and extending in a westerly direction on the south side of the Napan river, and to the southerly or rear line of the Napan lots, including the Wellfield Settlement, at or near the residence of Richard White, Wilson's Bridge.

Number Twenty-five—For the remainder of the electors of said Parish, at or near Black River Bridge, on the Richibucto Road.

5. That part of said Section 110 so far as it relates to the County of Sunbury, is hereby amended as follows:

By repealing the description of Number One, Parish of Burton, and enacting the following in place thereof:

**In the Parish of Burton.**

Number One—For all that part of said Parish lying north of Kinney Creek, at the Court House.

Number One (a)—For all that part of said Parish lying south of Kinney Creek, at or near Reuben Phillips.

6. That part of said Section 110, as amended by Section 10 of the Act 1 George V., Chapter 2, in so far as the same relates to the County of Victoria, is hereby amended as follows:

The description of sub-district Number Twelve, Parish of Gordon, as set forth in Section 10 of the Act 1 George V., Chapter 2, is hereby repealed and the following enacted in place thereof:

Number Twelve—For all that part of the Parish lying northerly of the dividing line between lands of George McDougall and the Turner Lot on the northerly side of the Tobique River, and the dividing line between lands of Robert Beveridge and Henry Beveridge on the southerly side of the Tobique River and the prolongation thereof to the limits of the Parish, at Piaster Rock.

**In the Parish of Perth.**

Sub-district Number Ten is hereby divided into two polling sub-divisions, to be described as follows:

Number Ten—For all that part of said polling sub-district, on the southerly side of the Tobique River, at or near David Currie's.

Number Ten (a)—For all that part of said polling sub-district on the upper or northerly side of said Tobique River, at or near Charles R. Williamson's.

7. Section 5 of 1 George V., Chapter 2, relating to the sub-districts in the County of Madawaska, is hereby repealed, and Section 1 of 7 Edward VII., Chapter 2, is hereby amended as follows:

**In the Parish of Clair.**

In the description of sub-district Number Two, strike out the words "at or near Noe Pelletier's" and substitute therefor the words "at or near Joseph P. Long's," making the description of said sub-district as so amended to read as follows:

Number Two—For the Parish of Clair, at or near Joseph P. Long's.

Number Twelve—For the Parish of Baker Lake, at or near Joseph Beaulieu's.

8. That part of Section 8 of the Act 1 George V., Chapter 2, amending "The New Brunswick Elections Act" relating to the County of Saint John, which reads as follows: "Sub-district Number Seven, the Parish of Musquash, is hereby made sub-district Number Nine," is hereby repealed and the following enacted in place thereof:

Section Seven of the Act 7 Edward VII., Chapter 2, is hereby amended by making sub-district number seven the Parish of Musquash, sub-district Number Nine, and sub-district Number Eight of the Parish of Musquash, sub-district Number Ten.

9. That part of said Section 110, so far as it relates to the County of York, is amended as follows:

**In the Parish of Douglas.**

Number Twenty is divided, making a new poll. The polling place for the new sub-division to be at the mouth of Keswick, at or near Leonard Yerxa's. To extend from Mouth of Keswick down the main River Road to Sandy Dunphy's lower line, taking in the Little Nashwaakias westward to Alexander Brewer's lower line.

**In the Parish of Bright.**

Number Twenty-two is divided. Polling place in the new sub-division to be at or near David Burt's. To extend down the main Keswick Road to Estey's Bridge, taking in the Back Road down to William Currie's lower line, along the Tripp Settlement Road, also taking in the Keswick Ridge Road to James Griffiths' upper line also taking the Zealand Road to Amasa Hanson's lower line, also all the back road from Morehouse Corner to its end.

10. That part of said Section 110 in so far as it relates to the County of Restigouche, is amended as follows:

Number Two, Parish of Dalhousie, is hereby divided into two polling sub-districts, to be designated as follows:

Number Two—Comprising all the Town of Dalhousie and that part of the Parish of Dalhousie lying northerly of the rear or base line of lots of the original grants fronting on
