

Restigouche River, and to the east of the Blair and Malcolm Road, at or near the Court House.

Number Two (a)—All the remaining part of the Parish not included in sub-districts Numbers One and Two, at or near Forester's Hall, Eel River Crossing.

11. Section 3 of the Act 1 George V., Chapter 9, is hereby amended by inserting the word "Road" between the words "Broad" and "lots" in the twentieth line thereof.

12. The Sheriffs of the respective Counties shall, upon the passage of this Act, make the division of the electoral lists necessary for the new sub-divisions, and the new lists so prepared shall be in all respects valid, and the Sheriff of any County may call upon the revisors of any Parish to assist him in the proper division of the names, and the necessary expense incurred shall be paid by the Receiver General of the Province of New Brunswick.

13. Section 107 of the said "The New Brunswick Elections Act," is hereby repealed and the following enacted in place thereof:

"107. (1) The representation in the Legislative Assembly shall be as follows:

"For the City of Saint John and the Counties of York, Charlotte, Northumberland, Gloucester and Westmorland, exclusive of the City of Moncton, each four members; for the Counties of King's, Carleton and Kent, each three members; for the Counties of Saint John, Sunbury, Queen's, Restigouche, Albert, Madawaska and Victoria, each two members, and for the City of Moncton one member.

(2) And each of said Cities and each of the said Counties mentioned in sub-section (1) shall form an electoral district and be entitled to return the members in said sub-section (1) specified to said Legislative Assembly.

(3) The provisions of any Act inconsistent with this Section are hereby repealed."

IN THE MATTER OF THE NEW BRUNSWICK JOINT STOCK COMPANIES' ACT.

NOTICE is hereby given, that application will be made by the applicants hereinafter named to His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council, for the grant of Letters of Incorporation under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick, under the provisions of The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act, and of the several Acts in amendment thereof, incorporating and constituting the applicants and such other persons as may become shareholders in the proposed Company, a body corporate and politic under the name and for the purposes hereinafter mentioned.

1. The proposed corporate name of the Company is "The Miramichi Publishing Company, Limited."

2. The objects for which incorporation is sought, and the powers of the Company, shall be as follows:

(f) To acquire by original subscription, or to take or otherwise acquire and hold shares and securities in any other companies authorized to do any business which the Company is authorized to carry on, or carrying out any business capable of being conducted so as directly or indirectly to benefit the Company.

(g) To sell, lease, mortgage, pledge or otherwise dispose of or encumber the undertakings of the Company, or any part thereof, and any or all of the real and personal property of the Company, for such consideration and in such manner and upon such terms and at such time and times as to the Company may seem desirable.
