

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that the parties hereinafter named will apply to His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council for a grant of Letters Patent of Incorporation under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick, according to the provisions of The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act, 1903, and amending Acts, incorporating the applicants and such other persons as may hereafter become shareholders in the proposed Company, a body corporate and politic, under the name and for the purposes hereafter set forth.

1. The proposed name of the Company is "Doherty & McHugh," (Limited).

2. The objects for which its incorporation is sought are:

(a) To purchase, acquire and take over the wholesale boot and shoe business at the City of Saint John at present carried on by Daniel J. Doherty and James H. (c) As principals, or for any other person or corporation, as commission merchants, brokers or merchants, agents or factors or warehousemen, to buy, sell, store, warehouse, exchange, import, export or otherwise handle, trade or deal in or with goods and merchandise of any kind whatsoever.

(d) To purchase, lease, acquire and to hold real or personal property of all kinds, and to take, have and acquire security upon any real or personal property or effects whatsoever.

(e) To sell, lease, mortgage, pledge or otherwise dispose of or encumber the undertaking or business of the Company, or any part thereof, or all or any real or personal property of the Company, for such consideration and upon such terms and in such manner as the Company may deem advisable.

(f) To acquire from any person or persons or body corporate, any business carried on for the manufacture or sale of leather or footwear or things incidental to the manufacture or sale of boots and shoes, and to continue such business or sell or dispose of the same or the assets thereof, or any part of the same.

3. The office or chief place of business of the Company is to be situated at the City of Saint John, in the City and County of Saint John, in the Province of New Brunswick.

4. The capital stock of the Company is to be twenty-four thousand dollars, divided into four hundred and eighty shares of fifty dollars each.
