

**NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN**, that the persons hereinafter mentioned and described, will apply to His Honour, the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council, for a grant of a Charter of Incorporation by Letters Patent under the New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act and the amending Acts thereto, incorporating the said applicants and such other persons who hereafter may become shareholders in the proposed Company, a body corporate and politic and for the objects and purposes hereinafter mentioned and set forth:

1. The proposed name of the company is "The Forest Home Fishing and Hunting Club, Limited."
