IN THE SUPREME COURT—KING'S BENCH DIVISION.

In the matter of Adams Burns Company, Limited, and its winding-up under "The Companies Winding-up Act," Chapter 90 of The Consolidated Statutes of New Brunswick, 1903, and amending Acts.

WHEREAS, the said Company did, at a general meeting of the said Company, duly held at its head office in Bathurst, on the first day of February, A.
