NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the persons hereinafter named will apply to His Honor the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council for a grant of Letters of Incorporation under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick, under the provisions of The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act and the several acts in amendment thereof, incorporating and constituting the applicants and such other persons as may become shareholders in the proposed company, a body corporate and politic under the name and for the purpose and objects and with the powers hereinafter mentioned and set forth.

1. The proposed corporate name of the company is Milltown, N. B., Cornet Band, Limited, which is not the name of any other company known to the applicants or name liable to be confounded therewith.

2. The objects for which incorporation is sought are:—
(a) To organize, control, manage, regulate and conduct in such a way as may be necessary to the general success thereof, a Band for the purpose of supplying public and other music in the Town of Milltown and other places in the Province of New Brunswick.

(b) To purchase, own, control, acquire musical instruments of all kinds, suitable for producing band music; also uniforms for bandmen and drums of all kinds used in the supplying of band music and such other instruments of music as may be necessary to fully equip an efficient band with up-to-date uniforms, instruments and other property necessary to equip the same.

(c) To purchase, lease, or otherwise acquire a building or property for the purpose of making headquarters for the band herein referred to in the Town of Milltown, with all the privileges appertaining to any lot which may be purchased.

(d) To sell or dispose of the property of the Company or any part thereof, including real and personal estate, at such time or times as may be agreeable and satisfactory to the shareholders thereof.

(e) To do all such other things as are incidental or conducive to the attainments of the above objects.

(3) The head office or place of business of the proposed Company is to be at the Town of Milltown, in the County of Charlotte, in the Province of New Brunswick.
