

NOTICE OF GRANTING LETTERS PATENT.

PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given, that under Chapter Eighty-five of the Consolidated Statutes of New Brunswick, 1903, and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the Great Seal of the said Province, bearing date the Sixth day of February, A. D. 1912, incorporating William Hawker, Druggist; Augustus H. Hanington, Barrister-at-Law; C. Berton Lockhart, Insurance Agent; George Heber Vroom, Insurance Agent; Arthur S. Belyea, Postal Clerk, and Charles S. Hanington, all of the City of Saint John, in the Province of New Brunswick, for the following purposes, namely:

To buy, hold, sell, invest in and trade in real estate, lands and tenements, and personal property and effects of all kinds, and to raise money by security thereon by mortgage, bill of sale or other security whatsoever, and to make, execute and deliver in due form of law, deeds, mortgages, bills of sale and other securities and liens of or upon any of the real and personal property of the said Company, for the purpose of conveying the same or giving security thereon for any loan or loans to the said Company, and to take, hold, receive, manage and control and accept in trust or as agents real and personal property and effects of all kinds for any person or persons or bodies corporate, including stocks of any company, and to hold the same in trust for the benefit of the person or persons or bodies corporate from whom the same is received, or from any person or persons whomsoever, and for such purpose to enter into and make or give any agreements receipts or contracts with or to any person or persons, or bodies corporate as to the holding of the said lands, monies, property and effects of all kinds.

To carry on business as investors, capitalists, financiers and brokers' agents and dealers in real and personal estate of all kinds, and to lend monies upon security of any real or personal property or effects, including bonds and stock of any company, and to substitute for and underwrite conditionally or otherwise, and to issue, or hold, or deal in any stock, shares and securities of all kinds, and to enter into any agreement for sharing profits or union of interests in any other company, and to invest money at interest on security of any freehold or leasehold lands, mines, farms, plantations or factories, or other property or effects of any kind, including patents and trade marks, and to purchase or acquire any undertaking or shares of any other company, and to carry on the business of such company for such time as shall be deemed expedient, and to purchase, acquire and deal in and hold in trust mines or mining rights, and to develop and conduct the business of mining minerals of all kinds, and to negotiate as agents or otherwise loans upon any real or personal property, stock or securities of every kind.

To guarantee the payment of dividends or interest on mortgages, bonds, stocks, shares, debentures or other securities whatsoever, and to take over the management, supervision or control of the business or operations of any company or undertaking upon such terms as may be agreed upon, and for such purpose to take, have and hold the stock of the Company, or a majority thereof, and to raise money on deposit at interest, and to advance and lend money upon such terms as may be agreed upon, and to transact and carry on all kinds of agency and real estate business, and to act as agents and trustees for the owners of real estate, or persons desiring to purchase real estate, and for the investment, loan, payment, transmission and collection of money for the transfer of bonds, debentures, shares and other securities, and for the purchase, sale and improvement, development and management of property, including business concerns and undertakings generally.

To borrow money upon the credit of the Company, to limit or increase the amount borrowed, to issue bonds, debentures or other securities of the Company for sums not less than one hundred dollars each, and to sell and pledge the same for such sums, and at such price as may be deemed expedient, and hypothecate, mortgage or pledge real and personal property of the company, or both, to secure any bonds, debentures or other securities for any money borrowed for the purpose of the Company.

To enter into and carry on and conduct the business of farming and dairymen, and dealers in farm products, and stock raising, and buying and selling stock of all kinds and in the manufacturing, buying and selling and dealing in farming implements, farm products and all or any of the articles aforesaid.

To carry on the business of dairymen and milkmen, manufacturers of cheese and butter and other farm products, and for such purpose to establish all such factories and depots as may be necessary or expedient.

To carry on the business of fruit growers or nurserymen, and the establishment of fruit farms, nurseries, orchards and gardens in connection with the growing of fruit of every description, and to buy and sell and deal in and trade in all the articles aforesaid.

To act as agents for and to conduct and carry on the business of immigration and colonization, and for such purpose to establish agencies and do and perform all things necessary or incidental to the bringing of immigrants to the said Province of New Brunswick, and establishing them on farms or lands of any kind in the said province, and for all or any of such purposes to publish and distribute literature descriptive of the Company's property or business and take such steps to bring immigrants and settlers to purchase its property or properties as may seem desirable.

Provided, always, that the Company shall only carry on the business of Immigration and Colonization subject to regulations which may be from time to time prescribed by the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council.

To carry on and conduct the business of lumber merchants and the manufacture of, lumber, timber and, all other products of wood, and to construct and operate dams, aqueducts, mills and manufactories for the manufacture of lumber as aforesaid, or for the manufacture, production, sale and disposal of water, hydraulic, electric, pneumatic or other power, and to erect poles and wires and to lay pipes, and do all other things necessary for the transmission of power, heat and light, or the supply, hire or sale of the same.

To carry on the business of merchants and general storekeepers, and do a general mercantile business; by the name of "New Brunswick & British Colonization Company, Limited," with a total capital stock of one hundred thousand dollars, divided into one thousand shares of one hundred dollars each, and with the head office at Fairville, in the Parish of Lancaster, in the City and County of Saint John.
