

## NOTICE OF GRANTING LETTERS PATENT.

**PUBLIC NOTICE** is hereby given, that under Chapter Eighty-five of the Consolidated Statutes of New Brunswick, 1903, and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the Great Seal of the said Province, bearing date the Sixth day of February, A. D. 1912, incorporating Albert C. Smith, Manufacturer; Harry A. Smith, Manufacturer; both of the City of Fredericton, in the County of York and Province of New Brunswick; William D. Rankine, of the Town of Woodstock, in the County of Carleton, Province aforesaid, Physician; Fred J. Boyer, of the Town of Florenceville, in the said County of Carleton, Merchant; John V. Johnston, of the City of Fredericton aforesaid, Capitalist; for the following purposes, namely:

To purchase, acquire, build, erect, construct, own, maintain, hypothecate, sell, lease, let, take over, hold, occupy, manage and operate dredges, dredging steamers, dredging plants, lighters, barges, boats, canoes, scows, tugs, pile drivers, engines, boilers, drills, equipments, buildings, implements, powers and appliances, as may be requisite, necessary or convenient for the said purposes, and for carrying on the business of the said Company.

To carry on, conduct and manage the business of dredging in and about the bays, harbors, rivers, straits, streams, channels, inlets, shores, water courses, and other waterways and places within the Province of New Brunswick and elsewhere and to make contracts and agreements to do and perform and to have done and performed such operations.

To construct, repair, alter, maintain and to contribute to the purchase, construction, repair, alteration, maintenance of any wharves, bridges, piers, docks, terminals, shipping facilities, or other works calculated to afford any facility in the business of shipping or navigation generally, or in carrying on, managing or extending the business of the Company, and to make and enter into contracts and agreements for the construction, purchase, alteration or maintenance of the same.

To acquire, purchase, use, hold, sell, transfer and dispose of any rights under patent or invention, franchises, and trade marks and other rights, and in lands, leases and rights in lands, tenements and hereditaments, in connection with the business of the said Company.

To acquire, hold and dispose of shares in any other company or companies, or to amalgamate with any other company or companies, or to acquire, purchase and take over any plant, stock, good will, franchise, business or assets of any other company or companies carrying on business of a similar nature to the said Company.

To acquire by original subscription, purchase, or otherwise deal in and to own, sell, transfer, pledge, mortgage or otherwise dispose of or incur, shares of capital stock, debentures, bonds or other obligations or evidences of interest in or all indebtedness of any other incorporated company or corporation authorized to issue shares, stocks, debentures, bonds, or other obligations, with power while the holder thereof to exercise all the rights and privileges of ownership, including the right to vote thereon.

To purchase, acquire, lease, hire or otherwise obtain any real or personal property, and to build, erect or otherwise acquire any factories, works or buildings, and to acquire any property, franchises, rights or privileges, which the Company may deem necessary and expedient, in connection with the carrying on of its business.

To lease, sell, mortgage, pledge or otherwise dispose of or incur the undertakings of the Company, or any part thereof, and any or all of the real or personal property of the Company for such consideration and in such manner and upon such terms as to the Company may seem desirable and right.

To do all things and everything necessary, proper, suitable, convenient or expedient for the accomplishment or attainment of any of the purposes or objects herein enumerated or incidental to the powers herein set forth, or which shall at any time appear necessary or expedient to do for the protection or benefit of the Company, to the same extent and as fully as natural persons might or could do; by the name of "The St. John River Dredging & Construction Company, Limited," with a total capital stock of fifty thousand dollars, divided into fifty shares of one thousand dollars each, and with the head office at the City of Fredericton.

**NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN**, that application will be made to His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council, for a grant of Letters Patent under the Provisions of the New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act, and Acts in amendment thereof, incorporating the applicants and such other persons as may become shareholders in the proposed company, a body corporate and politic under the name and for the purposes hereinafter mentioned.

1. The proposed name of the company is "The Provincial Fox Company, Limited."

2. The objects for which incorporation is sought are:

(a) To purchase or otherwise acquire and take over, own, hold, use, manage, let and lease, a farm or farms, or farm lands within the Province of New Brunswick, for the purpose of fox raising or fox farming, and for the purpose of raising, breeding and farming fur bearing animals.

(b) To enter into and carry on and conduct the business of fox raising and farming and fur bearing animals, raising and farming, buying, breeding, selling or trading in same, and for such purposes to build and erect upon said farm or farms, all buildings, outhouses, fences or appurtenances for the purpose of housing and maintaining such animals, and to act as agents in the buying and selling of foxes and fur bearing animals of every kind, and to hold or own any retail or wholesale shops or stores for the purpose of selling or disposing of skins of the same.

(c) To mortgage or sell the said real estate from time to time, or any portion thereof, as the said Company may direct, to borrow money upon the credit of the company, to lessen or increase the amount borrowed, to issue bonds or

debentures or other securities of the Company, and to sell and pledge the same for such sums and such prices as may be deemed expedient, and to hypothecate, mortgage or pledge the real or personal property of the Company to secure any bonds, debentures or other securities or money borrowed for the purposes of the Company.

(d) To cultivate and raise any crops upon the farms purchased or owned by the said Company, and to sell and dispose of the said crops from time to time, to lumber upon the said farms or any part thereof, together with the right to sell any lumber standing or being thereon, or to cut and sell the same either manufactured or unmanufactured.

(e) The head office or chief place of business of the said company is to be at Westfield, in the County of King's, and Province of New Brunswick.

(f) The amount of capital stock of the proposed company is forty-nine thousand dollars (\$49,000).
