

## PUBLIC NOTICE.

NOTICE is hereby given, that the persons hereinafter named will apply to His Honor the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council for a grant of a Charter of Incorporation by Letters Patent under the provisions of "The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act, incorporating the applicants and such other persons as may hereafter become shareholders in the proposed Company, a body corporate and politic, under the name and for the purposes hereinafter set forth, that is to say:

I. The proposed corporate name of the Company is "M. Haines, Limited," which is not the name of any other Company known to the applicants, or liable to be confounded therewith, or otherwise on public grounds objectionable.

II. The objects for which incorporation is sought are:

(a) To carry on in the Province of New Brunswick a general business in lumbering and in the purchase, sale and manufacturing of lumber and the products of lumber.

(b) To build, erect, equip, maintain, purchase, operate, sell, take on lease or otherwise acquire or dispose of saw mills, shingle mills, lath mills, box mills and other mills for the manufacture of wood and wood products in the Province of New Brunswick.

(c) To purchase, take on lease or license from the Crown or any person or persons, company or companies, and take by assignment or transfer leases or licenses granted by the Crown or by any person or persons, company or companies, or otherwise acquire timber lots, timber limits and rights to cut timber in the Province of New Brunswick, and to operate and to sell or otherwise dispose of the same.

(d) To lumber, cut, haul, get down, stream drive and to purchase or otherwise procure all kinds of timber or trees, whether growing on or severed from the soil, including saw logs, pulp logs, pulp wood, shingle logs, shingle wood, lath wood, railway ties and other kinds of wood, and to stream drive and otherwise get the same to market or to places of manufacturing, and to sell, manufacture and otherwise dispose of the same.

(e) To manufacture, buy, sell, transport or otherwise deal or trade in deal, planks, boards, shingles, laths and other kinds of sawn lumber and other goods and articles of all kinds in the manufacture of which lumber or wood is used.

(f) To buy, sell, purchase, trade in, barter or otherwise deal in goods, wares or merchandise, and to buy, sell, trade in and barter in other things capable of being used in connection with lumbering operations or the operation of saw mills or other mills for manufacturing any or all products of wood, or required by workmen and others employed by the Company.

(g) To purchase, take by lease or otherwise acquire water rights, water powers, electric power, and to generate water power or electrical power and electric light, and to sell or otherwise dispose of any or all of the same.

(h) For all or any of the purposes aforesaid, to purchase, take by lease or otherwise acquire lands, tenements and hereditaments in the Province of New Brunswick, and to construct, make, manufacture, purchase, take by lease or otherwise acquire, maintain and operate tramways, railways, machine shops and warehouses or other buildings for the storage of goods, wares, merchandise and provisions, lumber yards, railway sidings, piers, booms, cranes, hoisting gear and other articles and facilities for loading and discharging vessels and scows, and all materials, articles, tools, engines, boilers, tackle, apparel, furniture and machinery of all kinds.

(i) To sell, pledge, hypothecate, mortgage, lease, let or hire or otherwise dispose of the lands, tenements and hereditaments and other property of the Company, and generally to do all such things for the purposes hereinbefore set forth as fully as natural persons might do.

III. The head office or chief place of business of the Company is to be at Nashwaakias, in the Parish of Douglas, in the County of York and Province of New Brunswick.

IV. The amount of the capital stock of the Company is to be Forty-nine Thousand Dollars, divided into nine hundred and eighty shares of Fifty Dollars each.

## NOTICE OF GRANTING LETTERS PATENT.

PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given, that under Chapter Eighty-Five of the Consolidated Statutes of New Brunswick, 1903, and Amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the Great Seal of the said Province, bearing date the Ninth day of April, A. D. 1912, incorporating Henry Gilbert, of Rothesay, in the County of King's, and Province of New Brunswick, Agent; George W. Fowler, of the Town of Sussex, in said County of King's, Barrister-at-Law; William G. Pugsley, of the City of Montreal, in the Province of Quebec, Advocate; James Robinson, of Millerton, in the County of Northumberland, and Province of New Brunswick, Lumber Merchant; and Frank B. Carvell, of the Town of Woodstock, in the County of Carleton, and Province of New Brunswick, Barrister-at-Law, for the following purposes, namely:

To carry on the business of a real estate Company and for such purposes to buy, sell, lease and generally deal in lands, houses, cottages, shops, offices, hotels and other build-

ings and real estate of all kinds in this Province, and elsewhere; to erect, build and maintain buildings, cottages, railway sidings, railway spurs to and on such lands and premises, and make other improvements with full powers to lease, mortgage, sell or otherwise deal in the same, or any part thereof; to act as agents for persons owning or interested in real estate of all kinds, or in leasehold property, or both; to borrow money upon the credit of the Company, or upon the securities of its property or any part thereof; to issue bonds, debentures or other securities for the lawful purposes of the Company, and to pledge or sell the same for such sums and prices as may be deemed expedient or be necessary and to hypothecate any or all such bonds, debentures or other securities.

To manufacture, buy, sell or otherwise deal in cement, clay, bricks, lime, drain and other tiles in stone, terra cotta, drain and sewer pipes, gravel and artificial stone and its products, and all compositions into which any of the said articles or materials can be converted and used.

To construct, carry out, maintain, improve, manage, work, control and superintend any roads, ways, pipe lines, tramways, railway sidings, railway terminals, bridges, reservoirs, water courses, water powers, water rights, electrical works, factories, warehouses, shops and houses and other conveniences on lands owned or controlled by the Company, which may seem directly or indirectly conducive to or convenient for any of the objects of the Company.
