

## NOTICE OF GRANTING LETTERS PATENT.

**PUBLIC NOTICE** is hereby given, that under Chapter Eighty-Five of the Consolidated Statutes of New Brunswick, 1903, and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the Great Seal of the said Province, bearing date the Ninth day of April, A. D. 1912, incorporating John Robertson, Hotel Keeper; Albert T. Hinton, Trader; George Robertson, Hotel Keeper; William G. White, Lumber Merchant; Albert J. H. Stewart, Accountant, and George Windsor, Merchant, all of the Town of Bathurst, in the County of Gloucester and Province of New Brunswick, for the following purposes, namely:

To purchase and acquire, build, erect and maintain buildings, plant and machinery of all kinds, necessary for the generating, manufacturing and producing electrical power and to operate the same by steam, gas, water or other power of any nature, and to do so at any place or places within the Parish of Bathurst, and to sell electricity or electrical power, for lighting, heating or power purposes within the Town, Village and Parish of Bathurst, or elsewhere in the County of Gloucester.

To place, erect and maintain poles and other structures in, upon and along the highways, roads and public places within the said County of Gloucester, and to erect and maintain wires, or other devices for the conveying of electricity to the consumers or users thereof.

Provided, always, that any poles, wires, pipes or structures erected or placed along or across any highways, roads, streets and public places within the said County of Gloucester, shall be placed in such position as shall be approved by the Municipality of the said County.

To purchase, acquire, buy and sell, electrical machinery, fixtures, and equipment of every nature.

To carry on the business of electrical wiring and equipping and installing electrical machinery and devices of every description, and fixtures.

To contract with the Bathurst Light District, and any and all public bodies and corporations, or His Majesty, and with private persons, for the supplying of light to all and any streets and public places within the County of Gloucester, and for that purpose to erect such necessary light poles, lamps, equipment and devices in any and all such streets and public places and to maintain the same, and to receive rentals or other compensation for use of any plant or equipment of any and every nature.

Provided, always, that any poles, lamps, equipment and devices erected or placed along or across any highways, roads, streets and public places, shall be placed in such position as shall be approved by the Municipality of said County.

For any or all of the purposes aforesaid, and generally for the purposes of the Company, to have, hold, purchase and acquire real and personal property of every nature, and to mortgage, pledge or hypothecate the same, and any and all or any part or parts of its properties, plant and equipment for the borrowing of money for the purposes of the Company, and giving any and all manner of security therefor, by the name of "Gloucester Light and Power Company, Limited," with a total capital stock of twenty thousand dollars, divided into two hundred shares of one hundred dollars each; and with the head office at Bathurst, in the County of Gloucester.

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**PUBLIC NOTICE** is hereby given, that, under Chapter Eighty-Five of the Consolidated Statutes of New Brunswick, 1903, and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the Great Seal of the said Province, bearing date the Ninth day of April, A. D. 1912, incorporating Richard O'Leary, of the Town of Richibucto, in the County of Kent and Province of New Brunswick, Merchant; William B. Tennant, of the City of Saint John, in the County and Province of New Brunswick, Merchant; Thomas Nagle, of the said City of Saint John, Merchant; Frederick Ryan, of the Town of Sackville, in the County of Westmorland and Province aforesaid, Merchant; and Henry O. McInerney, of the said City of Saint John, Barrister-at-Law, for the following purposes, namely:

To carry on the business of a general dredging and construction company and contractors.

To engage in and carry on dredging operations and to enter into contracts for the same, and for that purpose to build, acquire and obtain by purchase, lease or hire, all boats, vessels, tugs, scows, dredges, stone lifters, plants, machinery and equipment for the carrying on of the same.
