PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS, under and by virtue of the provisions of the Act of the Legislative Assembly, 3 Edward 7, Chapter 24, the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council, for the reason set forth therein, did on the fifth day of February, last, pass an Order-in-Council declaring that no license or licenses for the sale of liquor either by wholesale or retail shall issue or be in force in the Parish of Caraquet in the County of Gloucester, from and after the publication in the Royal Gazette of a Proclamation giving notice of such Order-in-Council, and that such Proclamation shall be issued on the second day of July, A. D. 1913, and be published in the Royal Gazette to be issued on the said second day of July;

I do therefore, under and by virtue of the said Act of the Legislative Assembly and the Order-in-Council so passed as aforesaid, hereby proclaim and declare that no license or licenses for the sale of liquor either by wholesale or retail, shall be issued or be in force in the Parish of Caraquet from and after the publication of this Proclamation as aforesaid.
