

NOTICE is hereby given that within one month after the last publication of this Notice in the Royal Gazette, application will be made by the applicants hereinafter named to His Honour, the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council, for a grant of Letters Patent of Incorporation under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick, under the provisions of the New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act and the several Acts in amendment thereto, incorporating the applicants and such other persons as may become shareholders in the proposed Company a body corporate and politic under the name and for the purposes hereinafter set forth.

1. The proposed corporate name of the Company is "New Brunswick Black Foxes, Limited," which is not the name of any other company or liable to be confounded therewith.
2. The objects for which incorporation is sought and the powers of the Company shall be as follows:—
 - (a) To engage in a general ranching business for the breeding and rearing of foxes and other fur bearing animals in captivity.
 - (b) To buy, sell, exchange, acquire and otherwise deal in foxes and other fur bearing animals.
 - (c) To buy, sell, acquire and deal in raw and manufactured furs, skins, pelts and hides, manufactured and unmanufactured, and to tan, cure and preserve skins, pelts and hides of all kinds, and to transact any business relating thereto and to carry on the trade and business of buying, selling and dealing in furs and the breeding and raising of fur bearing animals.
 - (d) To make, execute and enter into contracts and agreements with any person or persons or with any company or companies having businesses similar in whole or in part to those of the proposed Company.
 - (e) For the purposes of its business or any of them to deal, purchase, lease, buy, sell or otherwise acquire and hold real and personal property of all kinds, with power to sell and dispose of the same.
 - (f) To acquire the good will, property, rights and assets and assume the liabilities of any person, firm or company carrying on or transacting any business similar to that conducted by the Company and to pay for the same in cash or in the stock or securities of the Company or otherwise, and to exchange shares in the Company for any of the purposes or objects of the Company.
 - (g) To acquire by original subscription or to take or otherwise acquire and hold shares and securities in any other companies authorized to do any business which the Company is hereby authorized to carry on, or carry on any business capable of being conducted so as directly or indirectly to benefit the Company.
 - (h) To sell, lease, make, pledge or otherwise dispose of or encumber the undertakings of the Company or any part thereof and any or all of the real and personal property of the Company for such consideration and in such manner and upon such terms and at such time and times as to the Company may seem desirable.
 - (i) To make application for and procure license to be registered in any foreign country or state and to apply therefor to any Government or authority, whether Federal, Provincial, Municipal, local or otherwise.
 - (j) To do any and everything necessary, incidental, suitable, convenient or proper for the carrying on of the said business or the accomplishment of any purpose or the attainment of any one or more of the objects herein enumerated or incidental to the powers herein contained, or which shall at any time appear conducive or expedient for the protection or benefit of the Company, either as carrying on said business or as holders of or as interested in any property or otherwise.
3. The head office or chief place of business of the said Company is to be at Salisbury in the County of Westmorland in the Province of New Brunswick.
4. The capital stock of the Company is to be sixty thousand dollars (\$60,000) divided into one hundred and twenty (120) shares of five hundred (\$500.00) dollars each.
