

## NOTICE OF GRANTING LETTERS PATENT.

**PUBLIC NOTICE** is hereby given, that under Chapter Eighty-five of the Consolidated Statutes of New Brunswick, 1903, and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the Great Seal of the said Province, bearing date the fifth day of February, A. D. 1913, incorporating: Charles Maxwell Lingley, Printer; Rupert W. Wigmore, Merchant; William James Brown, Traveller; all of the City of Saint John, in the City and County of Saint John; Hedley V. Dickson, of Parish of Rothesay, in the County of King's, in said Province, Farmer; and Edwin G. Evans, of the City of Montreal, in the Province of Quebec, Civil Engineer, for the following purposes, namely:

To carry on the business of a general construction company and contractors.
