

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that the persons hereinafter named will apply to His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council for a grant of Letters Patent of incorporation under the provisions of the New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies Act and amending Act, constituting the applicants and such other persons as may become shareholders in the proposed company, a body corporate and politic, under the name and for the purposes herein set forth.

1. The proposed corporate name of the Company is Polley & Co., Limited.

2. The purposes for which incorporation is sought are as follows:

"a" To purchase and take over from the present owners of the same all their right, title and interest in and to the business of manufacturing all kinds of chocolate candy and confectionery, and of buying, selling and dealing in fruits, nuts and general merchandise, at present carried on at the Town of Saint Stephen, in the County of Charlotte and Province of New Brunswick by John R. Polley, under the name, style and firm of Polley & Co., together with all the houses, buildings, erections, leases, improvements, appurtenances, good will and all stocks in trade, material in course of manufacture, goods and chattels, wares and general merchandise, machinery and rights of whatever nature, kind and description at present held, owned, controlled or claimed by the said Polley & Co.

"b" To carry on at the Town of Saint Stephen aforesaid, the business of buying, manufacturing, selling and dealing in all kinds of chocolate candy, confectionery, bread, cakes and biscuits, and of buying, selling and dealing in nuts, fruits, tobacco, cigars and general merchandise, and of roasting nuts, grinding and pulverizing sugar and other substances, and to carry on any other business in connection with and incident to the same.

"c" To acquire, possess, purchase, lease, hold, sell and convey real and personal estate and to build thereupon manufacturing, work shops, ware houses, store houses, dwellings, barns and all other buildings, structures and erections by the said Company or its Directors deemed expedient to be built and to lease or sell the same.

"d" To mortgage real and personal estate.

"e" To operate, lease, own, hold, buy and sell all mills, baking and roasting ovens and machinery necessary or incident to carrying on the said business, and generally to do all acts and things incident to the said business of manufacturing, buying, selling and dealing in all kinds of chocolate candy, confectionery, bread, cakes and biscuits, and buying, selling and dealing in nuts, fruits, tobacco, cigars and general merchandise and roasting nuts, and grinding and pulverizing sugar, cream of tartar and other substances.

"f" To carry on a general merchandise business.

"g" To buy, sell and deal in such other articles, goods, wares, merchandise and things as shall from time to time by the said Company or its Directors be deemed expedient.

"h" To bottle soda water and other temperance drinks and to do a general bottling business in respect thereto.

BRIDGE NOTICE.

SEALED TENDERS marked "Tender for Newcastle Bridge metal superstructure" will be received at the Department of Public Works, Fredericton, until Monday, 9th day of June, 1912, at noon, for constructing the metal superstructure of the Newcastle Bridge, over Miramichi River, between the Parishes of Newcastle and Chatham, Northumberland Co., N. B., consisting of the following:—

Four through fixed riveted connected steel truss spans, each 275 feet from centre to centre of end bearings.

One through swing riveted connected steel truss span of 228 feet, 3 inches from centre to centre of arm end bearings, according to Plans and Specifications to be seen at the Public Works Department, Fredericton, N. B.

Each tender must be accompanied by a certified bank cheque or cash for an amount equal to five per cent. of a grand total amount, made up as follows: 2,042,000 lbs. of metal superstructure at the tendered rate per lb.; plus the tendered lump sum for the roadway floor construction complete, embracing reinforced concrete base, concrete side curbs and creosoted wood block paving; plus the tendered lump sum for the construction complete of the wooden floor plank surface over the sidewalk. Such certified bank cheque or cash will be returned to the parties whose tenders are not accepted, but with the party to whom the contract is awarded, it shall be retained until the final completion of the contract and its acceptance by the Department.
