

NOTICE OF GRANTING LETTERS PATENT.

PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given, that under Chapter Eighty-five of the Consolidated Statutes of New Brunswick, 1903, and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the Great Seal of the said Province, bearing date the tenth day of July, 1913, incorporating John Arthur Lancelot Reid, Architect; Thomas Wilson, Surveyor; Alfred Edward Peters, Gentleman; George Malcolm McKiel, Clerk; and Harold Roy Peters, Accountant; all of the City of Moncton, in the County of Westmorland and Province of New Brunswick, for the following purposes, namely:

To purchase, lease or otherwise acquire, either for investment or re-sale, and to hold either absolutely as owner or as mortgagee or otherwise, and to traffic in land, houses and other property of whatsoever tenure, and any interest therein and to create, sell and deal in freehold and leasehold ground rents and generally to deal in, traffic by way of sale, lease, exchange or otherwise, in land and house property and any other property, whether real or personal; to carry on a general real estate agency business, including the undertaking of investigations, valuations, sales, exchanges, leases, subdivisions and the like.

To develop and turn to account any land acquired by or in which the Company is interested, and in particular by laying out and preparing the same for building purposes or otherwise, and by construction, altering, pulling down, decorating, maintaining, furnishing, fitting up and improving buildings, and by planting, paving, draining, farming, cultivating, letting on business lease or business agreement, and by advancing money to and entering into contracts and arrangements of all kinds with builders, contractors, tenants or others.

To construct, erect, build, repair and alter buildings and other structures, and to buy, sell and deal in stone, sand, lime, bricks, timber, hardware and other building requisites.

To make and to enter into any agreement or covenant for paving, macadamizing, repairing, grading, cleaning or watering streets or highways, and for the construction, opening and repairing of conduits, cisterns, drains, sewers or streets.

To acquire by purchase, lease or otherwise, or to undertake the whole or any part of the business, property or liabilities of any person or company carrying on any business which this Company is authorized to carry on, or possessed of property suitable for the purposes of this Company, and to pay for the same either in whole or in part in the bonds, debentures, paid up shares or other securities of the Company.

To acquire by purchase, lease or otherwise, or to take the shares, bonds, debentures or other securities of any company carrying on or about to carry on or engage in any business which this Company is authorized to carry on, and to sell, hold, re-issue with or without guarantee, or otherwise deal with the same.

To issue and allot fully paid shares of the Company in payment or part payment of any business, franchise, undertaking, property, right, power, privilege, lease, license or contract which the Company is authorized to acquire.

To sell, lease or otherwise dispose of the property and undertaking of the Company, or any part thereof, for such consideration as the Company may see fit, and in particular for shares, debentures, bonds or securities of any other company.

To enter into any arrangement for sharing of profits, union of interests, co-operation, joint adventure, reciprocal concession or otherwise, with any government, municipal or local authority, or with any person or company carrying on or engaged in, or about to carry on or engage in, any business or transaction which this Company is authorized to carry on or engage in, or any business or transaction capable of being conducted so as directly or indirectly to benefit this Company; and to guarantee the contracts of either, with or without security, and to lend money to, or otherwise assist any such person or company, or any person or company undertaking to build on or improve any property in which the Company is interested and generally to such persons or companies and upon such terms and conditions as the Company may think fit, and in particular to tenants, builders and contractors.

To guarantee the payment of money secured by or payable under or in respect of bonds, shares, contracts, mortgages, charges, obligations or other securities of any company or undertaking having objects altogether or in part similar to those of this Company.

To enter into any arrangements with any government or authority, federal, provincial, municipal, local or otherwise, that may seem conducive to the Company's objects or any of them.

To invest and deal with the moneys of the Company not immediately required, upon such securities and in such manner as may from time to time be determined.

To distribute any of the property of the Company in specie among its shareholders.

To do all or any of the above things as principals, agents, contractors or attorneys.

To do all such other things as are incidental or conducive to the attainment of any of the above objects.

Any power granted in any paragraph hereof shall not be limited or restricted by reference to or inference from any other paragraph hereof, or by reference to or inference from the name of the Company; by the name of "New Brunswick Land and Building Company, Limited," with a total capital stock of twenty thousand dollars divided into forty shares of five hundred dollars each, and with the head office at the City of Moncton, in the County of Westmorland, in said Province.

Brunswick, Merchant; Hugh R. Lawrence, of the Town of Saint George, in said County and Province, Gentleman; John A. Thompson, of Beaver Harbour, in said County and Province, Merchant; Bernard Connors, of Black's Harbour aforesaid, Bookkeeper; A. Gilmore Stewart, of the Parish of Saint George, in said County and Province, Millman; J. Edwin Connors, of Black's Harbour aforesaid, Bookkeeper; W. Jack Campbell, of the City of Saint John, in said Province, Clerk; and F. Howard Grimmer, of the Town of Saint Andrews, in said County of Charlotte, Barrister-at-Law, for the following purposes, namely:

To purchase, lease, take in exchange or otherwise acquire lands or interests therein, together with any buildings or structures that may be on the said lands or any of them, and to hold, sell, lease, exchange, mortgage or otherwise dispose of the whole or any portion of the lands, and all or any of the buildings or structures that are now or may hereafter be erected thereon, and to take such security therefor as may be deemed necessary.

To erect buildings and deal in building material.

To take or hold mortgages for any unpaid balance of the purchase money on any of the lands, buildings or structures so sold, and to sell, mortgage or otherwise dispose of said mortgages.

To improve, alter, manage and operate mills, factories, machine shops, foundries, stores, dwelling houses and buildings of all kinds.

To carry on the business of merchants and general storekeepers, and to do a general mercantile business.

To carry on and operate a general lumbering and sawmilling business in all its branches, including logging, driving, ponding, sorting, sawing, manufacturing, milling, dressing, drying, seasoning, marketing and shipping of all kinds and classes of logs and lumber and wood, manufactured and unmanufactured, including shooks and all kinds of short lumber, pulp wood, pulp and paper, and to buy, sell and deal in timber limits, leases and licenses, logs, timber, shooks, firewood and other lumber manufactured and unmanufactured, and in pulpwood, pulp and paper and all products and by-products thereof.

To acquire, hold, use and operate movable and immovable property, together with the rights, permits, licenses, water powers, water privileges, mills, mill privileges, mill buildings, wharves, dams, brows, piers, bridges, steam and other ships or vessels, tugs, scows, barges, of any and every kind with equipment and furniture, for the general purposes of its business and to sell, hypothecate, mortgage, pledge, alienate, exchange or lease the same, or any part thereof.

To construct, purchase, lease or otherwise acquire, operate, control, manage or deal in warehouses, stores, shops, sheds, yards, offices, hotels, boarding houses, restaurants, workmen's houses, dwellings, camps and structures of every description.

To carry on the business of electricians, manufacturers, dealers and workers in electricity, motive power, heat and light, and to manufacture and produce, and either as principals or agents, trade and deal in any article belonging or appertaining to such business, and all apparatus, appliances and things used in connection therewith.

To purchase or otherwise acquire and hold and dispose of the shares, stock, bonds or obligations of any company having objects similar in whole or in part to those of the proposed Company, or for which it may do or propose to do any business.

To amalgamate with any other Company or Companies having objects similar in whole or in part to those of the proposed Company.

To acquire, register, use and deal in any patents, patent rights, licenses and trade marks, processes or privileges, and to grant licenses thereunder.

To do any or all things set forth as objects, purposes, powers or otherwise to the same extent and as fully as natural persons might or could do, in any part of the world, as principals, agents, contractors, trustees, assignees or otherwise.
