

## NOTICE OF GRANTING LETTERS PATENT

**PUBLIC** Notice is hereby given, that under Chapter Eighty-Five of the Consolidated Statutes of New Brunswick, 1903, and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the Great Seal of the said Province, bearing date the Tenth day of July, A. To purchase, take on lease or license from the Crown or any person or persons, company or companies, and take by assignment or transfer lease or license granted by the Crown or by any person or persons, company or companies, or otherwise acquire suitable areas under or along bays, inlets, harbours, rivers, creeks and other basins, as well as foreshore, foreshore rights and deep water rights and any other interest in real estate.

To rake, fish by dredge or otherwise oysters and clams, and to carry on a general fishing business including drying, smoking, canning and curing of all kinds of fish, and to do all other things necessary for the proper marketing or otherwise disposing of the same.

To sell, pledge, hypothecate, mortgage, lease, let or hire or otherwise dispose of lands, tenements and hereditaments and other property of the Company and to deal in stocks common or preferred and to acquire and hold the whole or any part of the stock of any other company or companies carrying on any business which this Company is authorized to carry on, or possessing any property suitable for the purpose of this Company and to pay therefor any fully paid up or partly paid up shares of the Company, or any bonds, debentures or other securities of the Company, and likewise to sell or dispose of the whole or any part of the business, property or undertakings of this Company as a going concern or otherwise, for such consideration as the Company may think fit, and to accept therefor any fully paid up or partly paid up shares of any company having objects altogether or in part similar to those of this Company, or the bonds, debentures or other securities of such Company; by the name of "Oysters Limited," with a total Capital Stock of Four thousand dollars divided into Forty shares of One hundred dollars each, and with the head office at the City of Moncton in the County of Westmorland.
