

**NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN** that application will be made by those hereinafter named to His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council, for Letters Patent under "The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act" and amending Acts, for their incorporation as "The Fredericton Steamship Company, Limited."

1. The objects sought are:

(a) To purchase or otherwise acquire the Steamer "Hampstead" with all requisite equipment for the same, and to equip, own, control, sail, charter, let, hire and manage the said Steamer and such other steamer or steamers, if any, as may be hereafter purchased, built, owned, leased or otherwise acquired or controlled by the said Company, for the conveyance of passengers, mails and freights upon the waters of the River Saint John and its tributaries.

(d) To carry, convey or transport passengers, mails and freight of all kinds, and to do the work of common carriers by steamers, vessels and other conveyances, and in connection therewith to provide, furnish and sell food, refreshments and entertainment on water and land.

(e) To mortgage, hypothecate, sell, or in any way dispose of all or any of the Company's property, interests or possessions as may be deemed desirable by the Company.

(f) To hold, purchase or otherwise acquire, sell, assign, transfer, mortgage, pledge or otherwise dispose of shares of the capital stock and bonds, debentures or other evidences of indebtedness created by any other corporation or corporations, and while the holder thereof to exercise all the rights and privileges of ownership, including the right to vote thereon.

3. The amount of the capital stock is to be Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) divided into fifty shares of One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00), each.
