

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that application will be made to His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council for a grant of Letters Patent under the provisions of the New Brunswick Stock Companies' Act and amending Acts, incorporating and constituting the applicants and such other persons as may become shareholders in the proposed Company a body corporate and politic under the name and for the purposes hereinafter set forth:

1. The proposed corporate name of the Company is "New Brunswick Transportation Company, Limited."

2. The purposes for which incorporation is sought are as follows:

(a) To carry on the business of transporting freight and passengers by means of trucks, wagons or other vehicles, drawn or propelled by electricity, steam, gasoline, horses or by any other power.

(b) To buy, sell and deal in sand, gravel pits and limestone and other quarries, and to manage and operate the same, and to buy, sell and deal in sand, gravel and rock.

(c) To construct, purchase or otherwise acquire, and to sell or otherwise dispose of, and to maintain and operate trucks, wagons and other vehicles drawn or propelled by electricity, steam, gasoline, horses or by any other power.

(d) To erect and maintain a construction and repair shop for the construction and repair of the said trucks, wagons and other vehicles.

(e) To buy, sell and deal in machinery, apparatus and fittings employed in or in any way connected with the maintenance and operation of such trucks, wagons and other vehicles.

(f) To purchase, lease or otherwise acquire any lands or other property and to erect all such buildings as may be necessary for carrying on the business of the Company, and to sell, lease, mortgage or otherwise dispose of the same.

(g) To amalgamate with any other company or companies having powers similar to this Company.

(h) To acquire by purchase or otherwise and to hold, sell or otherwise dispose of stocks, bonds or obligations of any company having objects similar in whole or in part to those of this Company.

(i) To purchase and acquire the stock-in-trade, assets and effects, real and personal property, of any other person or persons now or hereafter carrying on any business of a similar nature to the business of this Company, and to continue such business so acquired, or to sell or dispose of the same, or of the assets thereof.

(j) To borrow money, to make and issue promissory notes, bills of exchange, bonds, debentures and evidences of indebtedness of all kinds, whether secured by mortgage, pledge or otherwise, and to secure the same by mortgage, pledge or otherwise.

(k) To carry on any other business which may seem to the Company capable of being conveniently carried on in connection with the above, or calculated directly or indirectly to enhance the value of the Company's property or rights.

3. The Head Office or principal place of business of the Company is to be at the City of Saint John, in the City and County of Saint John, in the Province of New Brunswick.

4. The amount of the capital stock of the Company is to be ninety-nine thousand dollars, divided into nine hundred and ninety shares of one hundred dollars each.
