

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that the persons hereinafter named will apply to His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council for a grant of Letters Patent of Incorporation under the provisions of the New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies Act and amending Act, constituting the applicants and such other persons as may become shareholders in the proposed company, a body corporate and politic, under the name and for the purposes herein set forth.

1. The proposed corporate name of the Company is Polley & Co., Limited.

"b" To carry on at the Town of Saint Stephen aforesaid, the business of buying, manufacturing, selling and dealing in all kinds of chocolate candy, confectionery, bread, cakes and biscuits, and of buying, selling and dealing in nuts, fruits, tobacco, cigars and general merchandise, and of roasting nuts, grinding and pulverizing sugar and other substances, and to carry on any other business in connection with and incident to the same.

"c" To acquire, possess, purchase, lease, hold, sell and convey real and personal estate and to build thereupon manufacturing, work shops, ware houses, store houses, dwellings, barns and all other buildings, structures and erections by the said Company or its Directors deemed expedient to be built and to lease or sell the same.

"d" To mortgage real and personal estate.

"e" To operate, lease, own, hold, buy and sell all mills, baking and roasting ovens and machinery necessary or incident to carrying on the said business, and generally to do all acts and things incident to the said business of manufacturing, buying, selling and dealing in all kinds of chocolate candy, confectionery, bread, cakes and biscuits, and buying, selling and dealing in nuts, fruits, tobacco, cigars and general merchandise and roasting nuts and grinding and pulverizing sugar, cream of tartar and other substances.

"f" To carry on a general merchandise business.

"g" To buy, sell and deal in such other articles, goods, wares, merchandise and things as shall from time to time by the said Company or its Directors be deemed expedient.

"h" To bottle soda water and other temperance drinks and to do a general bottling business in respect thereto.

3. The head office or place of business of the Company is to be at the Town of Saint Stephen, in the County of Charlotte and Province of New Brunswick.

4. The proposed capital stock of the Company is to be forty-nine thousand dollars, divided into four thousand nine hundred shares of ten dollars each.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that the persons hereinafter named will apply to His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council for the grant of a Charter incorporating by Letters Patent according to the provisions of "The New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies Act" and amending Acts, the applicants and such other persons as may hereafter become shareholders in the proposed Company, a body politic, under the name and for the purposes hereinafter set forth.

1. The proposed corporate name of the Company is "The Victoria Steamship Company, Limited."

2. The objects for which the incorporation of the said proposed Company is sought are:-

(a) To purchase, lease, take, acquire and hold the steamship "Victoria," and any other steamship or steamships, vessel or vessels, scow or scows, boat or boats which may become desirable for the successful carrying on of the undertakings of the Company or incidental thereto, and to furnish, equip and outfit any or all of the said steamships, vessels, scows and boats from time to time as may become necessary in the opinion of the said Company.

(b) To purchase, lease and otherwise acquire and hold any lands, tenements and hereditaments, and to build, construct, purchase, lease, take, acquire and hold, any steamship, vessel, scow, boat, wharf, pier, dock, warehouse, building, or other property or works, and any concession, license, or right in respect to the same or any of them, which in the opinion of the Company may be desirable for the carrying on, in any way, of the business of the Company.

(d) To sell, mortgage, hypothecate, pledge and otherwise dispose of or encumber the property and undertakings of the Company, or any part thereof, at one or different times for such consideration and in such manner and upon such terms as to the Company may seem desirable or expedient.
