NOTICE is hereby given that application will be made to the applicants hereinafter named, to the Honourable the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council for a grant of Letters Patent under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick, under the provisions of the New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act and the Acts in amendment thereof incorporating and constituting the applicants and such other persons as may become shareholders in the proposed Company, a body corporate and politic under the name and for the purpose hereinafter mentioned.
