APPLICATION FOR LETTERS PATENT

GRAND FALLS FRUIT GROWING AND FARM LAND COMPANY, LIMITED.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that the persons hereinafter named will apply to His Honor the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council for a grant of Letters Patent under the provisions of the New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies Act constituting the applicants and such other persons as may become shareholders in the proposed company, a body corporate and politic under the name and for the purposes hereinafter mentioned:

1. The proposed corporate name of the Company is, "Grand Falls Fruit Growing and Farm Land Company, Limited."

2. The objects for which incorporation is sought are: (a) To carry on the business of fruit-growers or nurserymen and to establish fruit farms, nurseries, orchards and gardens in connection with the growing of fruit of every description, and to buy, sell and deal in fruits of all kinds.

(b) To enter into and carry on and conduct the business of farming, dairying and stock raising, and to buy, sell and deal in farm and dairy products and live stock of all kinds.

(c) To purchase, lease, take in exchange or otherwise acquire lands or interests therein, together with any buildings or structures that may be on the said lands or any of them, and to sell, lease, exchange, mortgage or otherwise dispose of the whole or any part of the lands, or all or any of the buildings or structures that now are or may hereafter be erected thereon, and to take such security therefor as may be deemed necessary.

(d) To take or hold mortgages for any unpaid balance of the purchase money on any of the lands, buildings or structures so sold, and to sell, mortgage or otherwise dispose of the said mortgages.

(e) To improve, alter and manage the said lands and buildings.

(f) To sell, mortgage, hypothecate, pledge or otherwise dispose of or encumber the undertakings of the Company or any part thereof for such consideration and in such manner as the Company may deem desirable.

(g) To acquire, stock and securities by original subscription or otherwise of any other company having objects similar in whole or in part to the proposed Company.

(h) To amalgamate with any other company or companies having the same or similar objects, and to enter into all contracts or agreements necessary for such amalgamation.

3. The head office or chief place of business of the said Company is to be in the City of Saint John, in the City and County of Saint John and Province of New Brunswick.
