

Wasson, at the City of Saint John, in the City and County of Saint John, and at Gagetown, in the County of Queen's, together with the good-will, stock in trade, assets, leases, rights, credits and choses in action appertaining and belonging to the said business, and also all the book debts, books of account and general business of the said Charles R. (d) To engage in and conduct a general farming and dairy business, and to acquire, own and dispose of such plant, stock, tools, implements and machinery, and such other things as shall be necessary or incident to the proper carrying on of the same.

(e) To act as agent for any person or persons, incorporated or unincorporated companies, carrying on any similar business in New Brunswick or elsewhere.

(f) To acquire by purchase, lease, exchange or otherwise, and to hold, own and possess in fee simple, or in any less estate, or by way of grant or license from any Province, Municipality, Corporation or individual, and to employ, use, control and work any lands, buildings or other property, real or personal, and any interests therein, and any easements, franchises, rights or privileges which the Company may think necessary, suitable, desirable, or convenient for the purposes of its business, also plant, machinery, engines, works, horses, carriages and such like, and to sell and dispose of, mortgage, encumber or hypothecate any or all said property, both real and personal, or any part thereof.

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EXPROPRIATION NOTICE.

YOU and each of you are hereby required to take notice, that copies of a map or plan and book of reference, duly certified by the Chief Commissioner of Public Works of the Province of New Brunswick, of lands to be taken or expropriated by The Bathurst Electric and Water Power Company, Limited, from you for the carrying out of the undertaking of the Company, to acquire water powers, lands and right to flow lands with water, and right of way for pole or transmission line, under the provisions of Chapter 115 of the Acts of Assembly of New Brunswick, 1912, and The New Brunswick Railway Act and amending Acts, was filed by the Chief Commissioner of Public Works, in his office at Fredericton on the fifteenth day of July, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and thirteen, and in the office of the Clerk
