

PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given, that the persons herein-after named will apply to His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor of the Province of New Brunswick, in Council, for a grant of a Charter of Incorporation by Letters Patent under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick, under the provisions of the New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act, incorporating the applicants and such other persons as may hereafter become shareholders of the proposed Company a body corporate and politic under the name and for the purposes hereinafter set forth, that is to say:

The proposed corporate name of the Company is "Restigouche Lumber Company, Limited."

The objects for which the proposed incorporation is sought are as follows:

1. To build, erect, purchase, take by lease, or otherwise acquire, maintain, operate, sell or otherwise dispose of, saw mills, shingle mills, lath mills, box mills and other mills for manufacturing all products of wood in the Province of New Brunswick.

2. To purchase, take by lease or buy from the Crown, or from any person or persons, company or companies, and take by assignment or transfer of leases or of licenses granted by the Crown, or by any person or persons, company or companies, or otherwise acquire timber lands, timber limits and right to cut timber in the Province of New Brunswick and elsewhere and to sell or otherwise dispose of the same.

3. To lumber, cut, haul, get out, to purchase, or otherwise procure all kinds of timber and trees, whether growing on or severed from the soil, including saw-logs, pulp wood, shingle logs, shingle wood, lath wood, railway ties and other kinds of wood, and to sell, manufacture or otherwise dispose of the same.

4. To manufacture, buy, sell or otherwise deal or trade in deals, planks, boards, shingles, laths and other kinds of manufactured lumber and other goods and articles of all kinds in the manufacture of which timber or wood is used.

5. To purchase, construct, take by lease or otherwise acquire, operate or charter or navigate steam or sailing vessels, boats or row boats of every kind and nature whatsoever, and to sell, dispose of or otherwise deal in the same.

6. To repair, renew or rebuild steam or sailing vessels of every kind and description whatsoever.

7. To conduct and carry on a general merchandise business, wholesale or retail, or both, and the buying and selling of goods, wares and merchandise of every kind and description.

8. To store, warehouse, carry and transport goods, wares and merchandise of any kind whatsoever, for hire or reward, and to carry and transport passengers by land or water for hire or reward.

9. To construct, take by lease or otherwise acquire, maintain and for hire or reward operate wharves, docks, dry docks, graving docks and repairing docks in the Province of New Brunswick, and to sell or otherwise dispose of the same.

10. To purchase, take by lease or otherwise acquire, water rights, water power, electrical power or other power, and to sell or otherwise dispose of the same.

11. For all or any of the purposes or objects aforesaid: (a) To purchase, take by lease or otherwise acquire lands, tenements and hereditaments; (b) to construct, make or manufacture, purchase, take by lease or otherwise acquire, and to maintain all materials, articles, tools, engines, boilers, tackle, apparel, furniture, machinery of all kinds, cranes, hoisting gear and other appliances and facilities for loading and discharging vessels, tramways, railway sidings, piers, booms, machine shops, warehouses and buildings for the storage of goods, wares and merchandise.

12. To sell or otherwise dispose of the lands, tenements, hereditaments, water, electrical or other power, materials, articles, tools, machinery, engines, boilers, tackle, apparel, furniture, piers, booms, machine shops, warehouses and buildings and cranes and other appliances and facilities mentioned in the above clause numbered eleven (11).

13. To lease, sell, mortgage, pledge or otherwise dispose of or encumber the undertakings of the Company, or any part thereof, and any or all of the real or personal property of the Company, for such consideration and in such manner, and upon such terms as to the Company may seem desirable.

14. To do all things and everything necessary, proper, suitable or convenient for the accomplishment of any of the purposes, for the attainment of any one or more of the objects herein enumerated or incidental to the powers herein specified, or which shall at any time appear necessary or expedient to be done for the protection or benefit of the Company, either as owner of or interested in any property or otherwise to the same extent or as fully as natural persons might or could do.

The office and principal place of business of the Company is to be at Dalhousie Junction, in the County of Restigouche and Province of New Brunswick.

The amount of the capital stock of the company is to be seventy-five thousand dollars, to be divided into seven hundred and fifty shares of one hundred dollars each.
