# RULES AND PRACTICE OF THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF NEW BRUNSWICK.

### Private Bills.

75. A typewritten copy or printed copy of every Private Bill or Local Bill introduced into this House shall be filed with the Clerk of the House within ten days after the open-ing of the Session, and in case of failure to comply with this provision the fee on the introduction of any such Private Bill shall be double the fee provided for in Rule S4, applicable to such Bill, and Local Bills introduced after ten days of the opening of the Session shall pay the same fee as a Private Bill.

No Private Bill, or Bill making any amendments of a like nature to a former Act, shall be received by the House unless a notice specifying clearly and distinctly the nature and objects thereof, has been published four successive weeks previous to the meeting of the Legislature, or to the introduction of the Bill, in some one of the newspapers pub-lished in the County interested in or to be affected by the measure, or in the locality where the parties affected. or the majority of them, reside; and when no newspaper is pub-lished in the nearest adjoining County in which a news-paper is published, and also in the Royal Gazette. When the City or County interested in the measure or the locality in which the parties affected reside, is largely composed of a French newspaper, if any be published in the Province. 80.
