THE LIQUOR LICENSE ACT.

THE Liquor License Commissioners for the District of the City of St. John will meet in the Office of the Inspector, Chubb Building, 29 Princess street, on Thursday, the 23rd day of January, at 3 p. m., to consider and determine on the list of applications for license now on file, and to hear any objections that may be taken to any of the said applications.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that application will be made by the applicants hereinafter named, to His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council for a grant of Letters of Incorporation under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick, under the provisions of the New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act, and the several Acts in amendment thereto, incorporating and constituting the applicants and such other persons as may become shareholders in the proposed Company, a body corporate and politic under the name and for the purposes hereinafter mentioned.

1. The proposed corporate name is "Miramichi Black Fox Company, Limited."

2. The objects for which incorporation is sought, and the powers of the Company are:

(a) To engage in a general ranching business for the buying, acquiring, selling, exchanging, importing, exporting, breeding and rearing of foxes and other fur-bearing animals and the furs thereof.

(b) To engage in the business of rearing fur-bearing animals of all kinds, to tan, cure and preserve skins, pelts and hides of all kinds, to transact any business relating thereto, and to make, enter into and execute any contracts and agreements with any person or persons, company or companies having objects similar in whole or in part to those of this Company, for the housing, feeding, keeping, rearing or breeding of any such fur-bearing animals and relating to or being connected with the manufacture, curing, tanning, sale, purchase and exchange of furs.

(c) To acquire by purchase, lease or otherwise such real and personal estate as may be required or considered necessary for the business of the said Company, and to sell, encumber, mortgage or hypothecate the same as may be decided by the Company.

(d) To erect upon lands as acquired all houses, barns, pens, walls, fences and enclosures necessary, requisite or incidental to the purposes of such business.

(e) To amalgamate with any other Company in the same lines of business as those of this Company, and to acquire by purchase, subscription or otherwise, and to hold, sell or otherwise dispose of shares, stock, bonds or obligations of such other Company and to vote thereon as owners thereof.

(f) To acquire and dispose of patent rights, trade-marks and trade processes, secret or otherwise, in any way relating to such business.

(g) To do and perform any and all things above-set forth as objects, purposes and powers of this Company, to the same extent and as fully as natural persons may or can do, as principals, agents, contractors, trustees, assignees or otherwise, and all things necessary and incidental to the management and prosecution of such objects and business.
