

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that application will be made by the applicants hereinafter named to His Honor the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council for a grant of Letters Patent under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick, according to the provisions of the New Brunswick Joint Stock Company's Act, and the several Acts in amendment thereof, constituting the applicants, and such other persons as may hereafter become shareholders in the proposed Company, a body corporate and politic under the name and for the purposes hereinafter set forth:

1. The proposed corporate name is "Quoddy Coal Company, Limited."

 - (c) To acquire by purchase, lease or otherwise such real estate, docks, wharves, warehouses, operating plant and equipment as may be required for the business of the Company, and to sell, lease, encumber and mortgage the same.
 - (d) To acquire the good will, plant, rights and property of any kind, and to acquire and undertake the whole or any part of the assets, liabilities, contracts and engagements of any person, firm, association or corporation having a business undertaking or powers similar to those of this Company, and to pay for the same in cash, stock or bonds of this corporation or otherwise.
 - (e) To amalgamate with other Companies having powers similar to this Company.
 - (f) To acquire by purchase, subscription or otherwise, and to hold, sell or otherwise dispose of shares, stocks, bonds or obligations of any Company having objects similar in whole or in part to those of this Company, and to vote thereon as owners thereof.
 - (g) To acquire and dispose of patent rights, trade marks and trade processes, secret or otherwise.
