EXPROPRIATION NOTICE.

To George W. Dawson, Samuel E. Dawson, Artemus Dawson, George D. Freeze, and Edward Allison, senior:

YOU and each of you are hereby required to take notice, that copies of a map or plan and book of reference, duly certified by the Chief Commissioner of Public Works of the Province of New Brunswick, of lands to be taken or expropriated by The Bathurst Electric and Water Power Company, Limited, from you for the carrying out of the undertaking of the Company, to acquire water powers, lands and right to flow lands with water, and right of way for pole or transmission line, under the provisions of Chapter 115 of the Acts of Assembly of New Brunswick, 1912, and The New Brunswick Railway Act and amending Acts, was filed by the Chief Commissioner of Public Works, in his office at Fredericton on the fifteenth day of July, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and thirteen, and in the office of the Clerk of the Peace for the County of Gloucester (being the County in which said lands are situate) on the fifteenth day of July, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and thirteen, and that the lands therein particularly described, and which are to be taken from or expropriated from you, are therein described, and are described as follows:

Description of Lands to be Taken.
