

NOTICE OF LEGISLATION.

NOTICE is hereby given, that the Town of Bathurst will apply to the Legislative Assembly of the Province of New Brunswick at the next session thereof, for the passing of an Act,—

(a) To enlarge the boundaries of the present Bathurst Fire District so as to include the whole of the present Town of Bathurst.

(b) To authorize the Town to make an annual assessment upon the Town of Bathurst (in addition to other money required for fire protection) to pay the annual interest upon the present Bathurst Fire District Bonds or Debentures, and to provide sinking fund for redemption of same, and to transfer the custody of the present sinking fund to the Town of Bathurst, and to make the Town of Bathurst responsible for the payment of said bonds and interest thereon.

(c) To authorize the Town of Bathurst to issue debentures in an amount not exceeding \$20,000 for the purpose of paying the whole or part of the expense of having necessary plans and surveys made for and the installing of water and sewerage systems in the Town, and to pay for all necessary lands, rights of way, waters and water rights, and to expropriate such lands, rights of way and waters and water rights as may be deemed necessary for procuring and conveying water supply to the Town.

To take over and operate a fox ranch at Petitcodiac, in the County of Westmorland, now managed by Charles T. Munroe, one of the above mentioned applicants, and at present containing twelve foxes, together with pens, yards, houses and other buildings, etc.

To engage in a general ranching business for the breeding and rearing of foxes and other fur-bearing animals in captivity for market value and commercial purposes.
