

NOTICE OF GRANTING LETTERS PATENT.

PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given, that under Chapter Eighty-five of the Consolidated Statutes of New Brunswick, 1903, and amending Acts Letters Patent have been issued under the Great Seal of the said Province, bearing date the first day of May, A. D. 1913, incorporating William S. Montgomery, Merchant; James Wallace, Merchant; Alexander J. LeBlanc, Gentleman; William Gallop, Machinist; Claude Brown, Clerk, and Louis J. LeBlanc, Barber, all of the Town of Dalhousie, in the County of Restigouche and Province of New Brunswick, for the following purposes, namely:
