

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that application will be made by the applicants hereinafter named to His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council, for a grant of Letters of Incorporation under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick under the provisions of the New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act, and the several Acts in amendment thereto, incorporating and constituting the applicants and such other persons as may become shareholders in the proposed Company, a body corporate and politic under the name and for the purposes hereinafter set forth.

1. The proposed corporate name of the Company is "Canadian Gear Works, Limited."

2. The objects for which incorporation is sought and the powers of the Company shall be as follows:

(a) To carry on and operate the business of manufacturing, selling and dealing in vehicles of all or any kinds, and vehicle gears and all parts and things pertaining thereto, and to acquire, erect and maintain shops and plant for such manufacturing and business.

(b) To carry on a general foundry and machine shop business and to acquire, erect and maintain foundries and shops for the said purposes.

(c) To carry on and operate a general lumber business in all its branches, and to acquire, erect and maintain mills and plant for the said business, and to carry on a general building and contracting business.

(d) For the purposes of its business or any of them, to build, purchase, lease or otherwise acquire and hold real and personal property of all kinds, with power to sell and dispose of the same.

(e) To acquire the good will, property, rights and assets, and assume the liabilities of any person, firm or company carrying on or transacting any business similar to that conducted by the Company, and to pay for the same in cash, or in securities of the Company, or otherwise.

(f) To acquire by original subscription, or to take or otherwise acquire and hold shares and securities in any other companies authorized to do any business which the Company is authorized to carry on, or carrying out any business capable of being conducted so as directly or indirectly to benefit the Company.

(g) To sell, lease, mortgage, pledge or otherwise dispose of or encumber the undertakings of the Company, or any part thereof, and any or all of the real and personal property of the Company, for such consideration and in such manner and upon such terms and at such time and times as to the Company may seem desirable.

(h) To procure the Company to make application for and procure License to be registered in any foreign country or state, and to apply therefor to any Government or authority whether Federal, Provincial, Municipal, Local or otherwise.

(i) To do all and everything necessary, incidental, suitable, convenient or proper for the carrying on of the said businesses, or the accomplishment of any purpose, or the attainment of any one or more of the objects herein enumerated or incidental to the powers herein named, or which shall at any time appear conducive or expedient for the protection or benefit of the Company, either as carrying on said businesses or as holders of or as interested in any property, or otherwise.

3. The Head Office, or chief place of business of the said Company is to be at the Town of Newcastle, in the County of Northumberland, in the Province of New Brunswick.

4. The capital stock of the Company is to be forty-eight thousand dollars, divided into two classes of shares, viz.:—"A" Stock, being ordinary stock of the Company, and divided into two hundred and forty shares of one hundred dollars each; and "B" Stock, being Preference Stock of the Company, and divided into two hundred and forty shares of one hundred dollars each.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that application will be made to His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council, by the directors of Connors Brothers, Limited, a Company incorporated and organized under "The New Brunswick Joint Stock Company's Act" for the issue of Supplementary Letters Patent, to extend the powers of said Company to the following purposes and objects, viz.:

To purchase, own, produce, present, conduct and carry on and to license others to produce, present, conduct and carry on theatrical plays, operas, moving picture shows, dances and musical concerts and to acquire, hold, sell, assign and transfer copyrighted plays and non-copyrighted plays, operas, moving picture reels and music of all kinds, and for this purpose to build and own, lease, own or acquire theatres, play-houses or music and dance halls, moving picture halls, moving picture machines and all electrical appliances and all other equipment necessary for said purposes, and to give public or private performances and hold musical concerts and dances of any kind therein or elsewhere.
