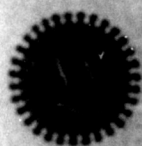

WHEREAS, the Legislative Assembly of this Province stands prorogued to Thursday, the ninth day of October, instant, I have thought fit to further prorogue the said Legislative Assembly, and the same is hereby prorogued accordingly, to Thursday, the twentieth day of November next.

Given under my hand and seal at Fredericton, the eighth day of October, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and thirteen, and in the fourth year of His Majesty's reign.

A PROCLAMATION.

E. L. NEWCOMBE, Deputy Minister of Justice, Canada. WHEREAS it hath pleased Almighty God, in His Great Goodness to vouchsafe this year unto Our Dominion of Canada a bountiful harvest and other blessings,—

We, therefore, considering that these blessings enjoyed by Our people throughout the said Dominion do call for a solemn and public acknowledgment, have thought fit, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council for Canada, to appoint, and We do hereby appoint Monday, the twentieth day of October next, as a day of General Thanksgiving to Almighty God for the bountiful harvest and other blessings with which Canada has been favoured this year; and We do invite all our loving subjects throughout Canada to observe the said day of General Thanksgiving.

Of all which our loving subjects and all others whom these

presents may concern, are hereby required to take notice and to govern themselves accordingly.

In testimony whereof, We have caused these Our Letters to be made Patent and the Great Seal of Canada to be hereunto affixed. Witness, Our Right Trusty and Well-beloved Counsellor the Right Honourable Sir Charles Fitzpatrick, Knight Grand Cross of Our Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George; Chief Justice of Canada; Administrator of the Government of Our Dominion of Canada.

At Our Government House, in Our City of Ottawa, this twelfth day of September, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and thirteen, and in the fourth year of Our Reign.
