NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that application will be made by the applicants hereinafter named, to His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council, for a grant of Letters of Incorporation under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick, under the Provisions of the New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act, and the several Acts in amendment thereto, incorporating and constituting the applicants and such other persons as may become shareholders in the proposed Company, a body corporate and politic under the name and for the purposes hereinafter mentioned.

1. The proposed corporate name is "The Great Canada Northern Black Fox Company, Limited."

2. The objects for which incorporation is sought, and the powers of the Company, are:

(a) To engage in a general ranching business for the buying, acquiring, selling, exchanging, importing, exporting, breeding and rearing of foxes and other fur-bearing animals, and the furs thereof.

(b) To engage in the business of rearing fur-bearing animals of all kinds, to tan, cure and preserve skins, pelts and hides of all kinds, to transact any business relating thereto, and to make, enter into and execute any contracts and agreements with any person or persons, company or companies having objects similar in whole or in part to those of this Company, for the housing, feeding, keeping, rearing or breeding of any such fur-bearing animals and relating to or being connected with the manufacture, curing, tanning, sale, purchase and exchange of furs.

(c) To acquire by purchase, lease or otherwise such real and personal estate as may be required or considered necessary for the business of the said Company, and to sell, encumber, mortgage or hypothecate the same as may be decided by the Company.

(d) To erect upon lands so acquired all houses, barns, pens, walls, fences and enclosures necessary, requisite or incidental to the purposes of such business.

(e) To acquire the goodwill, plant, rights and property of any kind and to acquire and undertake the whole or any part of the assets, plant, property and liabilities of any person, firm, association or company, or to amalgamate with any other company in the same lines of business as those of this Company, and to acquire by purchase, subscription or otherwise, and to hold, sell or otherwise dispose of shares, stock, bonds or obligations of such other Company and to vote thereon as owners thereof.
