NOTICE is hereby given that application will be made by the applicants hereinafter named, to His Honor the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council for a grant of Letters Patent under the Great Seal, according to the provisions of the New Brunswick Joint Stock Companies' Act, and Acts in amendment thereof, including the applicants and such other persons as may hereafter become shareholders in the proposed Company, a body corporate and politic, under the name and for the purposes hereinafter named.
