PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given that the persons hereinafter named will apply to His Honor the Lieutenant-Governor of the Province of New Brunswick in Council for grant of a charter of incorporation by Letters Patent under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick under the provisions of "The New Brunswick Joint Stock Company's Act" and amending Acts, incorporating the applicants and such other persons as may hereafter become shareholders of the proposed Company, a body corporate and politic, under the name and for the purposes hereinafter set forth, that is to say:
