PROCLAMATION.

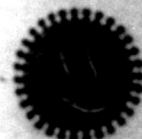

UNDER and by virtue of the provisions of the Act of the Legislative Assembly, 9 Edward VII., Chapter 16, intitled "An Act to amend the Liquor License Act, Chapter 22, Consolidated Statutes, 1903," and of Chapter 26 of the Acts of the Legislative Assembly, 4 George V., Section 4, and of an Order-in-Council duly passed on the twenty-eighth day of July last, I do hereby proclaim and declare, for the reasons set forth therein, that no Liquor Licenses, either wholesale or retail, shall be granted in the parishes of New Bandon or Inkerman, or either of them, in the said County of Gloucester, to be in force therein on or after the first day of January, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and fifteen, of which all persons will take due notice and govern themselves accordingly.
