## APPLICATION FOR LETTERS PATENT

### BOTSFORD FARMERS, LIMITED.

NOTICE is hereby given, that application will be made by the applicants hereinafter named, to His Honour the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council for a grant of Letters Patent under the Great Seal of the Province of New Brunswick, under the provisions of the Joint Stock Companies' Act of the said Province of New Brunswick, and Acts in amendment thereof and in addition thereto, to incorporate and constitute the applicants and such other persons who may become shareholders in the proposed Company, a body corporate and politic, under the name and for the purposes hereinafter mentioned.

1. The proposed corporate name of the said company is "Botsford Farmers, Limited."

2. The objects for which incorporation is sought are as follows:

(a) To engage in and carry on a general mercantile business and trade as wholesale and retail merchants and traders, and dealers in groceries and provisions, hardware, clothing, dry goods, boots and shoes, leathers and harnesses, furniture, coal, hay, grain, lumber, fuel, flour, potatoes, lumbermen's and fishermen's supplies and outfitings of all kinds, gasoline engines and fittings, oil and gasoline, motor appliances and parts, fish of all kinds, furs; and all kinds of commodities and merchandise; and to store and warehouse goods and to operate cold storage.

(b) To act as agents for merchants, manufacturers, fishermen or other persons, companies or corporations who may employ this company as agents in the transaction of any business, and to do all things incidental thereto.

(c) To acquire, use, register and dispose of patent rights, trade marks and trade processes, and to grant licenses and permits thereunder.

(d) To purchase or otherwise acquire and take over, from time to time, and to undertake and carry on the business, property, assets or liabilities of any person, firm or company carrying on a business which this company is authorized to carry on, or possess, and to purchase or acquire the goodwill and stock-in-trade of any business of a similar nature; and to pay for the same in cash, stock or bonds of this company or otherwise; and to amalgamate with other companies having powers similar to this, and to acquire by purchase, subscription or otherwise, and to hold, sell, hypothecate or otherwise dispose of and deal in shares, stocks, bonds or obligations of any company having objects similar in whole or in part to those of this company, and to vote thereon as owners thereof.

(e) To buy, sell, lease, mortgage, pledge, rent or otherwise acquire or dispose of any real property, freehold or leasehold, offices, stores, warehouses, wharves, factories and buildings of all descriptions adapted to the business purposes of this company, and to pay for the same in cash, paid-up stock of this company or of others, bonds, goods or merchandise; also to take security on real and personal property for amounts due the company.

(f) To borrow or raise money for the general purposes of the company, and to secure the same by mortgage, lien, hypothecation of the company's assets, or otherwise.

(g) To undertake and to do all such things as are incidental to and conducive to the general business of the company and the attainment of its various objects, to the same extent and as fully as natural persons might do, in any part of the world, as principals, agents, contractors, trustees, assignees or otherwise.

(h) To do anything and everything necessary, suitable, convenient, incidental to or proper for the carrying on of all the business of the company in its various branches, or any part or branch thereof, or for the accomplishment of any of the purposes of the company, or which appear to be conducive to the advancement of its business interests.

3. The head office and chief place of business of the company is to be at Port Elgin, in the County of Westmorland and Province of New Brunswick.

4. The amount of capital stock of the proposed company is to be forty-nine thousand dollars (\$49,000.00) divided into nineteen hundred and sixty shares of twenty-five dollars each, par value.

## LETTERS PATENT GRANTED

### THE SAINT GEORGE FOX COMPANY, LIMITED.

PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given, that under Chapter Eighty-five of the Consolidated Statutes of New Brunswick, 1903, and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the Great Seal of the said Province, bearing date the twentieth day of August, 1914, incorporating Hon. Daniel Gillmor, a member of His Majesty's Senate of Canada, and Henry I. Taylor, Physician, both of the Town of Saint George, in the County of Charlotte, and Province of New Brunswick; William L. Harding, of the City of Saint John, in said Province, Merchant; Edward J. O'Neill, Merchant, and Edward F. McGrattan, Merchant, of the Town of Saint George aforesaid; J. H. McGrattan, of the said Town of Saint George, Manufacturer, and Charles McGrattan, of the said Town of Saint George, Manufacturer, for the following purposes, namely:

To engage in a general ranching business for the breeding and rearing of foxes and other fur-bearing animals in captivity, and to buy, sell, exchange, acquire and otherwise deal in foxes and other fur-bearing animals, alive and captive, for breeding and rearing purposes, and for the production of fur for market and commercial uses and purposes.

To make, execute and enter into contracts and agreements with any persons or companies having objects similar in whole or in part to this company, for the housing, feeding, keeping, rearing and breeding of any such captive fur-bearing animals, and for the capture and taking into captivity of wild animals for propagation and breeding purposes and for furs.

To buy, sell, acquire and deal in raw and manufactured fur, skins, pelts and hides, and to tan, cure and preserve skins, pelts and hides of all kinds.

To purchase, acquire, sell, convey, lease and deal in real estate and any interest or term therein, and also to acquire personal property of all kinds, for the purposes of the businesses hereby authorized, and to sell and dispose of the same.

To acquire the good will, property, option, options, right and assets, and to assume the liabilities of any person, firm or company carrying on or transacting any business similar to that authorized to be conducted by the Company.

To acquire and dispose of patent rights, trade marks and trade processes, secret or otherwise.

To erect or provide upon the lands of the Company all houses, barns, pens and other buildings, walls, yards, fences and enclosures, and any other erections requisite or incidental to the purposes of the business.

To purchase, acquire, take over, sell, transfer and dispose of the good will of any company, firm or business, and the lands, hereditaments, rights, plant or other assets pertaining to the same, together with the privileges, franchises, rights and powers thereof, and in connection with said purchase or acquisition to assume the liabilities of any company, partnership or firm of persons, and to guarantee the performance of contracts and the payment of dividends and of the bonds and debentures of such company or companies, or persons.

Generally to acquire, take over, lease, take in exchange, hire or otherwise acquire any real or personal property, and to build, erect, purchase or otherwise acquire any factories, works or buildings necessary for the purposes of the Company, and to acquire as a going concern any business which the Company is hereby authorized to carry on, and to assume all or any debts or liabilities in respect thereof, and to acquire any property, franchises, rights or privileges which the Company may think necessary or convenient for all or any of the purposes of its business.

To amalgamate with any other company or companies having like or similar objects, and for that purpose to exercise all the rights and powers incident or necessary to complete the same.

To acquire by purchase or otherwise from any corporation, firm or person, any going business, property, rights or credits which the Company may be authorized to carry on or acquire.

To do all things and everything necessary or suitable or convenient for the accomplishment of any of the purposes or the attainment of any one or more of the objects herein enumerated, or which shall at any time appear conducive or expedient to do for the protection or benefit of the Company, either as owner of or interested in any property or otherwise, to the same extent or as fully as natural persons might or could do.

To construct, improve, maintain, work, manage and carry out or control any barns, pens, fences, ditches, walks, yards, enclosures, roads, ways, bridges, reservoirs, water courses, wharves, factories, warehouses, electric works, shops, stores and other works and conveniences which may seem calculated directly or indirectly to advance the Company's interests, and to contribute to, assist, facilitate or take part in the construction, improvement, maintenance, working, management, carrying out or control thereof; by the name of "The Saint George Fox Company, Limited," with a total capital stock of thirty thousand dollars, divided into six hundred shares of fifty dollars each, and with the head office at the Town of Saint George, in the County of Charlotte, in said Province.
