### LETTERS PATENT GRANTED

ACME BLACK SKUNK COMPANY, LIMITED.

PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given, that under Chapter Eighty-five of the Consolidated Statutes of New Brunswick, 1903, and amending Acts, Letters Patent have been issued under the Great Seal of the said Province, bearing date the fifth day of May, 1914, incorporating Norman P. McLeod, Contractor; Charles H. Ramsay, Commercial Traveller; Fred A. Kirkpatrick, Commercial Traveller; Charles M. Lawson, School Teacher; all of the City of Saint John, in the City and County of Saint John, and Harry F. McLeod, of the City of Fredericton, in the County of York, Barrister-at-Law; all in the Province of New Brunswick, for the following purposes, namely:
