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NOTICE is hereby given, that application will be made by the Town of Bathurst and by Bathurst Lumber Company, Limited, to the Legislative Assembly of New Brunswick at its next session for the passing of an Act—

1. To close that part of Old Miramichi Road, in the Town of Bathurst, extending northward from its junction with Caraque Highway to Bathurst Harbour; also the right of way from Caraque Highway to Caraque Railway Station and Machine Shop and other rights of way and landings in Town of Bathurst east of Nepisquit River, and to vest the soil right thereof in Bathurst Lumber Company, Limited.

2. To enable Town of Bathurst to close part of Highway leading to Nepisquit Bridge northwest of Nepisquit River, in Town of Bathurst, and to open a new highway in lieu thereof to the northward thereof, and to vest the soil right in the portion so closed in Bathurst Lumber Company, Limited.

3. To enable owners of "Y" branch of Caraque Railway to convey part thereof east of Caraque Highway, freed from all liens and encumbrances, to Bathurst Lumber Company, Limited, and to remove its station and railway buildings to another position, and that all liens and encumbrances on the portion so conveyed shall attach to the new station, buildings and branch, when built and acquired.

4. To enable Bathurst Lumber Company, Limited, to develop water powers on Nepisquit River, and establish and maintain electrical transmission line therefrom to Bathurst, and to lay a pipe line or lines from head of tide water of Nepisquit and Middle Rivers, and convey water from said rivers therein to its proposed pulp and paper mills, and for all of above purposes to expropriate all necessary lands and rights of way.

5. To fix the valuation for taxation purposes on properties of Bathurst Lumber Company, Limited, and pulp and paper mills to be erected thereon, for a period not exceeding thirty years.

6. To prohibit issue of licenses for sale of liquor in that part of Town of Bathurst east of Nepisquit River, and in Parish of Bathurst within one mile of eastern end of Nepisquit Bridge.

7. To enable any new company to be incorporated for purpose of building and operating pulp and paper mills at Bathurst upon or in connection with the properties of Bathurst Lumber Company, Limited, to have and exercise all the rights given, when incorporated, in same manner as same could be enjoyed by that Company under the proposed Act.
