

(r) To support and subscribe to any charitable or public object, and any institution, society or club which may be for the benefit of the Company or its employees, or may be connected with any town or place where the Company carries on business; to give pensions, gratuities or charitable aid to any person or persons who may have served the Company, or to the wives, children or other relatives of such persons; to make payments towards insurance, and to form and contribute to provident and benefit funds for the benefit of any persons employed by the Company.

1. The proposed corporate name of the Company is "The Island Fox Company, Limited," and the proposed name is not that of any other known Company incorporated or unincorporated, nor is it a name liable to be confounded with the name of any other known company, or otherwise objectionable on public grounds.

2. The objects and purposes for which such incorporation is sought are:

(a) To engage in a general ranching and farming business for the breeding and rearing of foxes and other fur-bearing animals in captivity, for market value and commercial profit and in sheep of all kinds for like purposes.
