

2. The objects for which incorporation is sought are as follows:

(a) To engage in a general ranching business for the breeding and rearing of foxes, sheep and other fur bearing animals in captivity, and to buy, sell, exchange and otherwise deal in foxes, sheep and other fur bearing animals alive and captive for breeding and rearing purposes and for the production of fur for market and for commercial uses and purposes.

(b) To buy, sell, acquire and deal in raw and manufactured and unmanufactured furs, skins, pelts, hides and to tan, cure and preserve skins, pelts and hides of all kinds.

(c) To make, execute and enter into agreements and contracts with any persons, firms or companies having objects similar in whole or in part to that of the proposed Company, for the housing, feeding, rearing or breeding of any such captive fur bearing animals, and for the capture and taking into captivity of wild animals for propagation purposes and breeding purposes and for furs.

(d) To purchase, lease and otherwise acquire, and to have, hold and possess, sell and dispose of all kinds of real and personal property for the purposes of the Company.

(e) To acquire and dispose of patent rights, trade marks and trade processes secret and otherwise.

(f) To erect, provide and maintain upon the lands of the Company houses, barns, pens and other buildings, walls, yards, fences and other enclosures necessary, requisite and incidental to the purposes of such ranching business.

(g) To carry on a general farming, agricultural, poultry and butchering business.

(h) To amalgamate with any other company or companies having powers similar in whole or in part with those of the Company.

(i) To acquire the good will, real and personal property, options, rights and assets, and to assume the liabilities of any person, firm or corporation carrying on or transacting any business similar in whole or in part to that authorized to be conducted by the Company, and to pay for the same in cash or in stock, shares, bonds or securities of the Company or otherwise, and to acquire shares in any other company for any of the purposes or objects of the company to be created.

(j) To draw, make, accept, endorse, discount, execute and issue promissory notes, bills of exchange, bills of lading, warrants and other negotiable and transferrable instruments.

(k) To sell, mortgage, hypothecate, pledge or otherwise dispose of or encumber the undertaking of the Company, or any part thereof, and the real and personal property of the Company, or any part thereof, for such consideration and in such manner, and upon such terms as to the Company may seem desirable or expedient.

(l) Generally to acquire, take over, lease, take in exchange, hire or otherwise acquire any real and personal property, and to build, erect, purchase or otherwise acquire any houses, works or buildings, and to acquire as a going concern any buildings which the Company is hereby authorized to carry on, and to assume any debts or liabilities in respect thereof, and to acquire any property, franchise, rights, or privileges which the Company may think necessary or convenient for all or any of the purposes of its business, and to pay for the same or any part of the same, wholly or in part, in fully paid up shares, bonds or debentures of the Company or either of them in connection with the business of the Company.

(m) To do all such other things as are incidental or conducive to the attainment of the above objects or any of them.

3. The head office or chief place of business of the said proposed Company is to be at Petitcodiac in the Parish of Salisbury in the County of Westmorland.

4. The amount of the capital stock of the said Company is to be Twenty-Six Thousand Dollars, divided into Two Thousand Six Hundred Shares, of the par value of Ten Dollars each.
